OUR COUNTRY: First, Last and Forever. The Republican, which is generally conservative and reliable, makes the statement that the new telephone company secured the right of way to Pottsville mainly because the three judges on the Shenycill county bench are directly or indirectly interested in the company.

THE Miners' Journal has manfully come out in the open, and declares its opposition to Messrs. Brumm, Whitehouse and Schrick as party leaders. Upon that proposition the party press of the county is a unit, and in that sense the journals merely express the sentiments of the rank and file of the party voters.

THE advice given by Vicar General Koch, of Shamokin, to those miners in that vicinity who contemplated a strike in sympathy with the strikers at Nanticoke, while not in accord with the plans of some of the officers of the United Mine Workers, was emphatic in denunciation of the proposed strike. He advised the men against striking if they had no grievances of their own; that if they had such grievances they should endeavor to arbitrate them and that he would assist them in an effort to secure a fair adjustment of differences. The men very wisely took his advice. Rev. H. F. O'Reilly, of the Annunciation church, of town, on Sunday addressed the members of his parish along the same lines, and cautioned his hearers against the professional labor agitators and strongly advocated arbitration as a means of settlement of whatever differences that may exist between the men and their employers.

THE Home Paper. A well known writer in one of the widely circulated monthlies gave voice to an opinion which has a solid basis of good sense and keen judgment. He said that it was a man's duty as a loyal citizen to patronize a home paper. A man that has the interests of the town at heart and wishes for its advancement cannot, with justice to his avowed interest, leave out a liberal patronage of the home papers, either in advertising space, if he is a business man, or by subscription.

"A newspaper," said Lincoln one day when several newspaper men were plying him with questions at a railroad station, "is a part of a town—just as much as its town hall or its post office." If this be true, then why should a citizen who wishes his town well leave out patronizing home papers? What you are interested in—or should be—the welfare and affairs of our town—are not contained in the city papers.

The way to get a good national government is begun by having a good municipal government; and the way you can get a good municipal government is to start in and want it—work for it. Without a newspaper you can't work—you are only blindly trying; you can't do the work of a dozen reporters and editors in finding out the doings of the community.
