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A PROTEST FROM RUSSIA.

M. Rontovsky Denounces Attacks on His Country's Credit. Washington, Dec. 18.—M. Rontovsky, the agent of the ministry of finance of Russia in Washington, in a communication which has received the approval of the Russian ambassador, complains of the attempts which he says were made in Europe recently to create in this country the impression that the relations between the governments of Japan and Russia were strained.

Immediately after these statements had been authoritatively denied by the Russian ambassador and the Japanese minister here, says M. Rontovsky, "other sensational rumors were started, presumably at Berlin, and directed against the credit of the Russian empire. These were followed by libels directed against the eminent statesman to whom credit was attributed."

Mr. Rontovsky adds that in view of the fact that all these false rumors and misstatements, if not exposed, might leave among capitalists and financiers in this country an erroneous impression, he has decided to give to the press some figures on the subject.

These figures show that during the 12 years from 1887 to 1899 the ordinary currency of the Russian government was constantly in excess of \$20,000,000,000 in 1887 to 1,554,000,000 rubles in 1898, and that during the whole of that time, with the exception of two years (1887 and 1891), the expenses were constantly less than the receipts.
