**MORNING IN MANILA.**

General Lawton's Body Removed to El Paso Cemetery.

TO BE BURIED IN ARLINGTON.

In the Engagement in Which the Brave Officer Met Death Thirteen Americans Were Wounded and the Flying Rebels Left Six Dead.

Manila, Dec. 21.—Major General Lawton's body was brought from San Mateo to Manila yesterday afternoon, his staff and a squadron of cavalry acting as escort. It was found necessary to bridge the river.

The funeral will take place from his late residence here, a mansion formerly occupied by a Spanish general. The body has been placed temporarily in a vault in El Paso cemetery, where many of the American soldiers have been interred, and a guard of honor will be maintained by the cavalry.

General Lawton's death has caused universal sorrow in Manila. No American officer had greater popularity among all ranks, and in his dealings with the natives he commanded their respect and confidence to a remarkable degree. The manner in which he was killed in the neighboring town is being arranged to attend the funeral in a body.

To his executive ability and personal leadership is chiefly due the brilliant execution of the plan of campaign in North Luzon, which has scattered the insurgents from San Isidro to the Gulf of Lingayen. That section of the island, which had to be traversed during the very worst season of the year, presented difficulties considered by all acquainted with it to be almost insurmountable, but General Lawton thoroughly covered the program assigned him. When he reached Tayug and found that the other division had not arrived, he went through to Dagupan on his own responsibility. Although the route was considered dangerous, he invariably shared their lot cheerfully.

Thirteen Americans, including three officers, were wounded in the engagement at San Mateo, where General Lawton was killed. Captain Breckenridge's wound is not considered dangerous, although the bullet penetrated his arm and side.

It is estimated that the insurgents numbered 500, and that half of them were armed with rifles. The Americans numbered 1,300, but the command had been depleted by sickness.

The wagon train found the roads impassable and was obliged to return. The insurgents retreated to the northeast, leaving six dead.

They have retreated near Taytay. This region, although close to Manila, has proved the most difficult from which to dislodge the enemy. It is now reported that the insurgents intend to concentrate at San Cruz Laguna province, and in the district east of Laguna de Bay.

The American secret service reports that Aguinaldo has joined the Marikina force.

**A Fand For Lawton's Family.**

Washington, Dec. 21.—General Lawton died a poor man, although but few beyond his circle of immediate friends knew of the small pecuniary return that had come to him from his life work. Much of his personal property, therefore some of these friends have thought proper now to come to the aid of his family. A piece of property purchased by him as a home in California has a mortgage of half the purchase price still outstanding and unliquidated. Contributions will be received by H. G. **President McKinley Sends the Document to the Senate.**

NEED FOR IMMEDIATE ACTION.

Secretary Hay Calls Attention to the Fact That a Sufficient Number of Ratifications Will Soon Be Obtained to Organize the Tribunal.

Washington, Dec. 21.—The president yesterday sent to the senate the treaty negotiated by the powers of the Hague last July for the pacific settlement of disputes between nations and the declaration to prohibit for five years the launching of explosives from balloons. The senate immediately reviewed the treaty and advised the president's message was a formal letter of transmission, except that it invited attention to an accompanying report from the secretary of state, containing the ratifications of the United States, Belgium, Denmark, Spain, Mexico, France, Portugal, Romania, Russia, Siam, Sweden and Norway and Bulgaria, and a copy of a declaration to prohibit, for a term of five years, the launching of projectiles and explosives from balloons or by other new methods of a similar nature.

The original of each of these two instruments was signed in a single copy which remains in the archives of the Netherlands government. The department of state advised that since July 29 the signatures of the plenipotentiaries of Italy, Austria-Hungary, Luxembourg and Serbia have been attached to the convention.

"In making the convention the following declaration was made by the plenipotentiaries of the United States: 'Nothing contained in this convention shall be construed as to require the plenipotentiaries of America to depart from its traditional policy of not intruding upon, interfering with or entangling itself in the political questions or policy or internal administration of any other nation, and nothing contained in the said convention be construed to imply a relinquishment by the United States of America of its traditional attitude toward the participation of any nation in the affairs of another nation.'

"I respectfully recommend that the attention of the senate be called to the importance of immediate action being taken on the convention, in view of the fact that a sufficient number of ratifications will soon be obtained to authorize the organization of the tribunal, and the large part taken by the United States in the preliminary work renders it desirable that this country should not occupy a secondary place."
