### HEROES OF THE MAINE.

Bodies of the Dead Sailors in Their Final Resting Place.

IMPRESSIVE FUNERAL RITES.

Five Survivors of the Great Disaster Were Present to Pay a Last Tribute of Respect to the Men Whose Lives Cost Spain Her Colonies.

Washington, Dec. 29.—Upon the windy heights of Arlington cemetery the Maine dead, brought from Havana by the battleship Texas, yesterday were laid away in their final resting place with simple religious services and the impressive honors of war in the presence of the president, members of the cabinet, officers of the army and navy and other representatives of the government. A cabinet officer, surveying the flags draped about the ceremonies, said: "The lives of those men cost Spain her colonies."

The caaskets interred yesterday ranged row on row. Over each was spread an American ensign, upon which lay a wreath of galax leaves. Around the caaskets up the cavity of Fort Meyer, to the right was a battalion of marines from the navy yard and to the left a detachment of jacks from the Texas. In the flag draped stand in the rear were the president and his cabinet, Admiral Dewey, Major General Miles and a distinguished group of officers of the army and navy, while all around pressed the throng of people who had braved the snow and biting cold to pay their last tribute to the dead. Among these were many relatives and friends of those who had been lost in the disaster.

There was a tender appropriateness in the fact that Captain Sigbee, who was in command of the Maine when she was blown up, had charge of the ceremonies in honor of his men and that Father Chidwick, who was chaplain of the Maine, was there to perform the funeral services. Those who lived through that awful night in Havana harbor were at the side of the graves of their comrades—Lieutenant Commander Wainwright, who was executive officer of the Maine and who sank the Pluton and the Furor at Santiago; Lieutenant C. G. Cowley, who was assistant engineer of the Maine, and Jeremiah Shea, a fireman on the Maine, who was blown out of the stove hole of the ship through the debris, escaping unharmed and most miraculously.

The Marine band had played the dirge, "Safe in the Arms of Jesus," the Protestant services were held, and were very simple. Chaplain Clark read the burial service of the Episcopal church and then gave away to Father Chidwick, who was assisted by Rev. Holand and Brown and two purple robes. With the three men bared to the windy blast the Maine's chaplain read a memorial service according to the rites of the Catholic church, consigned the dead, blessed the ground, repeated the Lord's Prayer and concluded with a fervent appeal for the repose of the souls of the departed. A detachment of marines then marched to the right of the graves and fired three volleys over the dead, and in the deep stillness that followed the crash the clear, silvery notes of a bugle rang out the soldiers' and sailors' last good night.

The tolling of taps the ceremonies ended. The president and his party and the other distinguished guests, the military and the crowds then withdrew. Before leaving Captain Sigbee introduced Jeremiah Shea to the president. When asked for an explanation of the mystery of his escape by the president, Shea responded, as he did to a similar inquiry from Father Chidwick at the time of the disaster: "I don't know how I got through. I was blown out. I guess I must have been an armor plating projectile."

### A NEW LINE TO EUROPE.

Vessels Will Sail Weekly From New York For Liverpool.

New York, Dec. 29.—Arrangements have been completed by Frederick Layland & Co., Limited, of Liverpool, for the establishment of a weekly passenger and cargo line between New York and Liverpool. The new line, which will constitute the most important addition to transatlantic service in recent years, will have in operation within two months six big vessels, and will conduct a weekly service similar in methods to those of the Atlantic Transport Line, now running between this port and London.

### Illinois' Governor Will Not Try For a Renomination.

Senator Cullom Has Declined His Renomination Would Elect a Democratic Senator, and He Says It Will Not Impair His Power.

Springfield, Ill., Dec. 29.—At the gathering of Illinois Republicans for their annual convention a resolution was adopted yesterday by the declaration of Governor John R. Tanner that he was not a candidate for re-election. This declaration was made at a special meeting of the governor's political friends, called by himself. He said: "I have not been a candidate for governor from the time that I entered office, and I am not now a candidate for re-election."

### An Important Fish Decision.

Stromburg, Pa., Dec. 29.—Judge Albright, of Lehigh county, yesterday handed down an important fish decision in the trespass cases brought by the Polkham Fish Association against Messrs. Depp, Eley and Seipin of Wind Gap. The three latter will have to pay the costs, which amount to \$116.79. Several disputed points in regard to the rights of fishermen and owners of streams are established. A fisherman is guilty of a trespass who enters a stream and fishes without the consent of the land owner, although he wades the stream and does not touch dry land. The fact that the state has stocked the streams with fish does not make it a public stream.
