

PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO THE CONSTITUTION SUBMITTED BY THE CITIZENS OF THIS COMMONWEALTH FOR THEIR APPROVAL AT THE NEXT GENERAL ASSEMBLY.

Section 1. Be it resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, That the following are proposed as amendments to the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania...

Section 2. Amend section eight of article four of the Constitution of Pennsylvania, which reads as follows: "He shall nominate and, by and with the advice and consent of two-thirds of all the members of the Senate, appoint a Secretary of the Commonwealth..."

Section 3. Amend section twenty-one of article four, which reads as follows: "The term of the Secretary of Internal Affairs shall be four years..."

Section 4. Amend section eleven of article five, which reads as follows: "Except as otherwise provided in this Constitution, justices of the peace or aldermen shall be elected in the several wards, districts, boroughs and townships..."

Section 5. Amend section twelve of article five of the Constitution, which reads as follows: "In Philadelphia there shall be established, for each thirty thousand inhabitants, one court, not of record, of police and civil causes..."

Section 6. Amend section two of article eight, which reads as follows: "The general election shall be held annually on the Tuesday next following the first Monday of November..."

Section 7. Amend section three of article eight, which reads as follows: "All elections for city, ward, borough and township officers, for regular terms of service, shall be held on the third Tuesday of February..."

Section 8. Amend section four of article eight, which reads as follows: "District election boards shall consist of a judge and two inspectors, who shall be chosen annually by the citizens..."

Section 9. Amend section one, article twelve, which reads as follows: "All officers, whose selection is not provided for in this Constitution, shall be elected or appointed as may be directed by law..."

Section 10. Amend section two of article fourteen, which reads as follows: "County officers shall be elected at the general elections and shall hold their offices for the term of three years..."

Section 11. Amend section seven, article fourteen, which reads as follows: "Three county commissioners and three county auditors shall be elected in each county where such officers are chosen..."

Section 12. That no inconvenience may arise from the changes in the Constitution of the Commonwealth, and in order to carry the same into complete operation, it is hereby declared that...

Section 13. Amend section two of article fifteen, which reads as follows: "The general election shall be held biennially on the Tuesday next following the first Monday of November..."

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and civil causes, with jurisdiction not exceeding one hundred dollars; such courts shall be held by magistrates whose term of office shall be five years and they shall be elected on general ticket by the qualified voters at large...

In Philadelphia there shall be established, for each thirty thousand inhabitants, one court, not of record, of police and civil causes, with jurisdiction not exceeding one hundred dollars...

The general election shall be held annually on the Tuesday next following the first Monday of November, but the General Assembly may by law fix a different day, two-thirds of all the members of each House consenting thereto...

All elections for city, ward, borough and township officers, for regular terms of service, shall be held on the third Tuesday of February...

District election boards shall consist of a judge and two inspectors, who shall be chosen annually by the citizens, each elector shall have the right to vote for the judge and one inspector...

All officers, whose selection is not provided for in this Constitution, shall be elected or appointed as may be directed by law...

County officers shall be elected at the general elections and shall hold their offices for the term of three years, beginning on the first Monday of January next after their election...

Three county commissioners and three county auditors shall be elected in each county where such officers are chosen, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-five and every third year thereafter...

Section 12. That no inconvenience may arise from the changes in the Constitution of the Commonwealth, and in order to carry the same into complete operation, it is hereby declared that...
