MULEFOOT HOGS.

Animals Which Have Attracted Great Attention Wherever Exhibited.

Breeders of swine in many sections of the country are greatly interested in mulefoot hogs, and these animals have attracted considerable attention in recent years when exhibited at the State fairs. These hogs are now being improved and bred under the name of ugard hogs.

A Kansas breeder, Dr. W. J. Conner, who is raising them, says that, while in a measure they are a new thing, yet he has been breeding them

long enough to have ascertained that they are actually the best range hogs in existence to-day. He has found, he says, that they will live and prosper where a common hog would starve to death.

The meat of these hogs, he declares is sweeter than that of common hogs, and there is a larger proportion of lean to fat. They may be finished at any age, and it is possible to bring them to a weight of from 500 to 800 pounds. It seems that these hogs have been tried out in practically every State in the Union, and Dr. Conner says that they have never had cholera.

Spring or Fall Pigs.

Fall pigs generally prove unprofitable unless the feeder can utilize feed that would otherwise be wasted in keeping them through the winter. Pigs that are reared through the winter make good gains when put on pasture in the spring, and when fattened in the late summer and early fall often bring in fair profits. On account of coming to maturity at the right time to breed for the spring litters we have found them very desirable to keep for brood sows. The second season gives them a great bone and muscle development at a low cost. Warm drinks, light, warm and dry quarters, succulent food, with frequent changes of bedding and diet, and a properly balanced ration, will insure good growth in winter; but unless we are in the best shape to look after all these details, we find it best to confine our feeding to spring pigs.

Preparing Woil for Market.

Many farmers, says a wool buyer, are using up to two cents a pound in their wool by not paying attention in preparing it for market. There are cases where it might just as well be put into a bale with a pitchfork and trodden down. Practically everything goes in together—fleece, bellies, locks, tags, short and long staple; fine and coarse; merino and cross-bred. Now what can a buyer make out of this? How can he tell the proportions of each in a bale? The consequence is that only a low value all around can be risked and many buyers will not bid for it at all.

Grist for the Farmer.

The loader and the hay fork make the job shorter and easier than ever. How about that old leaky wooden tank? A cement tank will not dry out.

If the cellar needs ventilation and it generally does, open the doors and windows at night instead of in the daytime. Have screens to keep out cats, rats, etc.

Stir the earth. Remember the agitation is death to all worms of the soil. Man never devised a more useful and valuable instrument than the hoe in all its forms.

Rich Fodder and Rich Manure. Leguminous hay is very much more nutritious than the hay from other grasses even such as timothy.

The clover and bean tribe contain nearly twice as much protein as the ordinary grasses. The manure from the legumes contains a proportionately larger share of nitrogen (also more potash) than the manure from other grasses.

In stabling horses or cows never place the hay where they have to reach up to feed. When the head of the animal is up dust may get into the eyes.
