


HANDY BEE HIVE CARRIER

Get It Ready for Putting the Hives Out in the Spring.

To make a bee hive carrier similar to that shown in the accompanying illustration, select two small saplings about six feet long and hew a flat sur-



USING THE BEE HIVE CARRIER. face on each or them. Nail a board four feet long and 12 inches wide on each flat surface as indicated. The saplings can be cut any desired length.

Honey and Money.

In the first place the honey bees are of far more value to the farmer than they are credited with. They are worth more as pollenizers for all clovers than the bumble bee. I have seen them on the first crop when I was cutting it for hay and if it is dry and the supply of blossoms short for the seed crop they will work on that as much as the bumble bee, writes J. C. in a bee journal. For a fruit crop they can't be beat. They commence with the first blossoms on the peach, cherry, apple, raspberry, blackberry, and in fact with all kinds of fruit. I have ever seen them gathering pollen on the corn tassels.

Besides being good pollenizers, they are as profitable in the way of money as almost any other stock, considering the amount o cost of outlay. Once you get your hives, with proper care they are no more trouble, only the time to get the honey I prepare for wintering. I generally keep twelve colonies. They furnish us with honey three times a day the year round, and on an average get about \$30 to \$35 per year, which is the easiest money I get during the year. We can learn a valuable lesson by watching them in the way of industry. Of course they may eat some grapes, but there are more grapes rot on the vines than the bees destroy, so I don't consider it much loss after all. Some people are afraid of the sees, but if you get good Italians and behave properly, it ic very seldom they will sting. I for one would much rather rob the bees than some people and run the risk of getting hurt. I find my bees are much easier to handle at extracting times than most others are. All farmers ought to keep enough bees to furnish them with honey the year round. It is one of the nost valuable articles that goes to the table. There are many things, too numerous to mention, that are of value to us all in the ...oney bee so keep a few colonies, and have all the honey the children can eat. It is more healthful than medicine.

Pearlessness and painstaking gentleness are requisites in the successful handling of bees. By thoroughly frightening the bees with smoke in the hive and then shaking them they are tumbled together in confusion, an expert may gently schoop them up in his ands before an audience and pour them on his bare arms and head without harm. 3-tter not try it however, unless you are an expert.

Northern beenceners do not feel safe with less that 25 to 30 pounds of honey to the colony for winter stores. As our cold season is shorter, we may do with a little less. It is also said that a mud climate takes less sustenance i. the bees do not fly

Overtime for Bees.

"I have just snipped my bees to California, said a beekeeper. "My bees work over ime. No hibernating for them.

"In the spring I send them down South, and they toll like blazes among the Southern fowers. In summer 1 bring them here to the East working them till the honeysuckie and the clover are quite gone. The autumn season finds them in Florida, where they make a peculiarly rich and aromatic honey from the Florida flowers. California gives them all they can do in the winter.

"It's a splendid idea, isn't it, to keep one's bees in a perpetual state of work? I got the idea from those hotel keepers of Europe who have winter hotels on the Riviera and summer hotels at Dinard or Trouville. My traveling bees yield thrice as much honey as stay-at-home ones."
