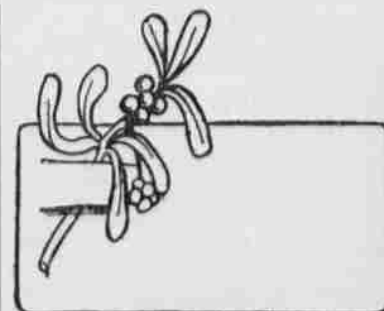
THE apple and cherry and peach and plum

Decorations For the Christmas Table Should Be Appropriate
