International Congress Meets at Washington In September.

THE FIRST GATHERING HERE

Elaborate "Exhibition on Health" Will Be a Feature-To Consist of Nine Sections-Twenty-five Foreign Countries Will Send Delegates,

For the first time in the sixty years of its existence, since it was called into being in 1852 to meet the great pandemic of cholera in Europe, the international congress on hygiene and demography will hold its sessions in this country in direct response to the invitation of the president and the congress of the United States. The meetings will be held in Washington, Sept. 23-28. In connection with the congress there will be one of the most elaborate "exhibitions on health" ever assembled. The exhibit will be opened the second week in September and will continue three weeks.

Even though the congress has behind it the history of giving formal indorsement to such epoch making discoveries as the Pasteur treatment for rables and the antitoxin treatment for diphtheria and giving to the world the knowledge which enabled medical practitioners everywhere to take adcantage of these discoveries it is anticipated that the fifteenth congress in the advancement of health than has any previous congress.

This urpose is well outlined in the formal anouncement of the exhibition on salth which the department of state as just issued and which specifies hat "one of the pressing needs of the imes is the standardization of hydenic methods and the co-ordination and the correlation of the work of fedral state, municipal and private health gencies."

The congress will be divided into ine sections, each of which will have s own program, and the work proosed for the various sections will be nnounced from time to time as it is etermined. The exhibition will be eld in a specially constructed building vast area now being erected in Poomac park.

"The work of the congress is of speial importance to the government and itizens of the United States," said Dr. ohn S. Fulton, secretary general of he organization. "The congress will ring together about 3,000 of the most stinguished specialists, and other iousands will be attracted by the exbition. Problems of the greatest imortance to the United States will be scussed in the sections and Illustratin the exhibition, such as the cure nd prevention of tropical diseases, the ispection of animals and meat prodrts and federal, state and municipal ganization for the preservation of ublic health.
