

FIFTY-SECOND CONGRESS

Proceedings of the Senate and the House Tensely Told.

FIFTY-THIRD DAY. SENATE.—Some of the Senators were in an economic mood this morning when the bills making the several appropriations came up.

HOUSE.—In the House filibustering against the New York & New Jersey Bridge Company bill proved ineffectual today.

FIFTY-FOURTH DAY. SENATE.—The consideration of the sundry civil appropriation bill was today proceeded with the pending amendments being regarded to the site for a new government printing office building.

HOUSE.—Business was obstructed in the House today by successful filibustering against the anti-option bill.

FIFTY-FIFTH DAY. SENATE.—Washington's birthday was commemorated in the Senate today by the reading of his farewell address.

HOUSE.—The first of what is said will be a daily series of conflicts between the anti-option bills and the anti-option bill until the latter is acted on.

FIFTY-SIXTH DAY. SENATE.—In the Senate today within less than an hour two of the general appropriation bills—the diplomatic and military and the military—were read, considered and passed.

HOUSE.—On motion of Mr. Hitt in the House today a bill was passed for the relief of George W. Jones, late United States minister to New Grenada.

FIFTY-SEVENTH DAY. SENATE.—The debate in the Senate today was over the question whether the Utah Commission, which has been in existence for the last 10 years, should be abolished.

FIFTY-EIGHTH DAY. SENATE.—The legislative appropriation bill passed the Senate today, that body insisting on its amendments.

WASHINGTON. Mr. Harter of Ohio introduced in the House a free coinage bill which puts silver and gold on the same terms as prior to 1873.
