Sec. 3. All telegraph, telephone, electric light and electric rallway poles now erected or hereafter to be erected in the Borough of Reynoldsville, which are or shall be owned by any firm, indi-vidual or corporation, shall be desig-nated by the names or initial of such owner, and each of such poles shall bear a distinctive number, together with the a distinctive number, together with the names or initials, and the number shall be legibly marked in oil paint upon the poles so designated; it shall be the duty of every such owner or owners annually on the 1st day of April in each year, to make application to the Street Committee and Clerk for a license to maintain the poles theretolore erected for the ensuing year, specifying the poles to be maintained by their proper designation as provided for in this section and the Council shall cause the Clerk to issue a license to such applicants, which shall a necesse to such applicants, which shall authorize the maintainance of the poles designated in the application only for a period of one year from the meeting next ensuing the date of said applicanext ensuing the date of said applica-tion, and the charge of issuing such a license shall be the sum of fifty cents for each and every pole authorized to be maintained thereby and shall be paid to the Borough Treasurer for the use of the Borough.

Sec. 4. No telegraph, telephone, electric light or electric rallway pole shall be maintained within the corpo-rate limits of the Borough of Reynoldsville without an annual license for the maintainance of the same shall have been previously granted in accordance with the provisions of Sec. 3 of this ordinance. Any privilege heretofore granted by resolution or ordinance for the erection or maintainance of poles for any of said purposes are hereby re-pealed. Any person violating the pro-visions of this ordinance shall be liable to a fine of five dollars for each and every pole so maintained without a license, to be recovered as debts of like amount are now by law recoverable. Sec. 5. After the date of this ordi-nance it shall be unlawful for any person, persons, individual or corporation to nail, tack or paste any sign or adverto nail, tack or paste any sign or adver-tisement on any telegraph, telephone, electric light or electric railway pole or poles within the corporation limits of the borough of Reynoldsville and the nailing, tacking or pasting of any such sign or advertisement on any pole or poles as aforesaid, shall be deemed a public and common nuisance public and common nuisance. Any person, persons, individual or corporation violating the provisions of this section of this ordinance shall upon conviction thereof pay a fine of five dollars for each and every sign or advertisement so put up, which fine shall be paid to the borough treasurer for the use of the borough and shall be collected as debts are now by law collected. are now by law collected. Any person, individual or corporation owning poles within the corporate lim-its of the borough of Reynoldsville are hereby authorized to prosecute any per-son or persons found violating the pro-visions of this section of this ordinance but in such prosecutions the borough of

(\$1.00) dollar. Sec. 3. The said Street Committee shall notify the person, firm or corpora-tion owning or operating any wires or lines, whenever the attachments, insulators, supports or appliances are unsultable or unsafe and insufficient and if the same shall not be corrected and remedied within forty-eight hours after notice, the said Street Committee shall cause the same to be forthwith removed at the expense of such individual, firm or corporation and shall also require all or corporation and shall also require all abandoned or dead wires wherever found to be removed and upon failure or refusal by any such person or firm or corporation to pay the same, the said Street Com-mittee shall enforce its payment by proper action at law in the name and for the use of the Borough of Reynolds-ettle. ville.

c. 4. The said Street Committee shall have the right and it is made its duty to prescribe from time to time, reasonable rules and regulations for carrying out and enforcing the provisions of this ordinance and not provisions of this ordinance and not inconsistent herewith such rules and regulations to be approved by Council, and shall have the right to enforce the same as well as the provisions of this ordinance through such person or persons as shall from time to time be required authorized and angelated so required, authorized and appointed so to do.




