

Borough Ordinances.

(No. 39)

Sec. 1. Be it ordained by the Town Council of the Borough of Reynoldsville, Pa. assembled, and it is hereby ordained by authority of the same, That whenever permission shall have been granted by Council to any firm, corporation or individual to construct a line of telegraph, telephone, electric light or electric railway poles in or upon any street, lane, alley or public square of the Borough of Reynoldsville, it shall be the duty of the said firm, corporation or individual before any poles shall be erected to submit to the Street Committee and Borough Clerk, a written application specifying the number and size of poles intended to be erected and designate the places where the same are to be inserted, and if no objections are made thereto, it shall be the duty of the Town Council to direct a license to be issued to said applicant for the erection of the specified poles at the designated places of insertion; and in no case shall shade trees be interfered with by either poles or wires; in case of objection being made to the whole or any part of such application, it shall be the duty of the Council to hear the same and grant the license either in accordance with the application or with such conditions and modifications to secure the purposes of this ordinance and the protection of the citizens as the case may require; no poles shall be erected without the license, granted by the Council and certified by the Clerk, shall have been previously obtained therefore, as provided in this section, and for every such license so granted there shall be paid to the Borough Treasurer the sum of fifty cents for each pole.

Sec. 2. It shall be the duty of the Street Committee to cause a thorough inspection to be made at least once every year on all telegraph, telephone, electric light or electric railway poles erected within the corporate limits of the Borough of Reynoldsville, and if any pole shall be found defective from any cause, they shall notify the corporation, firm or individual owning such pole who shall forthwith replace the same with a sound pole and if the said owner refuses or neglects to replace such defective poles within forty-eight hours after receiving such notification, he or she shall be liable to a fine of five dollars for each and every day during which said neglect or refusal shall continue after notice, to be collected as debts of like amount are now by law recoverable.

Sec. 3. All telegraph, telephone, electric light and electric railway poles now erected or hereafter to be erected in the Borough of Reynoldsville, which are or shall be owned by any firm, individual or corporation, shall be designated by the names on initial of such owner, and each of such poles shall bear a distinctive number, together with the names or initials, and the number shall be legibly marked in oil paint upon the poles so designated; it shall be the duty of every such owner or owners annually on the 1st day of April in each year, to make application to the Street Committee and Clerk for a license to maintain the poles thereto erected for the ensuing year, specifying the poles to be maintained by their proper designation as provided for in this section and the Council shall cause the Clerk to issue a license to such applicants, which shall authorize the maintenance of the poles designated in the application only for a period of one year from the meeting next ensuing the date of said application, and the charge of issuing such a license shall be the sum of fifty cents for each and every pole authorized to be maintained thereby and shall be paid to the Borough Treasurer for the use of the Borough.

Sec. 4. No telegraph, telephone, electric light or electric railway pole shall be maintained within the corporate limits of the Borough of Reynoldsville without an annual license for the maintenance of the same shall have been previously granted in accordance with the provisions of Sec. 3 of this ordinance. Any privilege heretofore granted by resolution or ordinance for the erection or maintenance of poles for any of said purposes are hereby repealed. Any person violating the provisions of this ordinance shall be liable to a fine of five dollars for each and every pole so maintained without a license, to be recovered as debts of like amount are now by law recoverable.

Sec. 5. After the date of this ordinance it shall be unlawful for any person, persons, individual or corporation to nail, tack or paste any sign or advertisement on any telegraph, telephone, electric light or electric railway pole or poles within the corporate limits of the Borough of Reynoldsville and the nailing, tacking or pasting of any such sign or advertisement on any pole or poles as aforesaid, shall be deemed a public and common nuisance.

Any person, persons, individual or corporation violating the provisions of this section of this ordinance shall upon conviction thereof pay a fine of five dollars for each and every sign or advertisement so put up, which fine shall be paid to the Borough Treasurer for the use of the Borough and shall be collected as debts are now by law collected.

Sec. 6. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

(No. 40)

AN ORDINANCE relating to the erection, use and operation, construction and inspection of wires used for electrical purposes, providing for the inspection and supervision of the same upon streets and within buildings and providing for the appointment of inspectors thereof.

Whereas, it is the duty of Council, to establish ordinances to provide for the safety, comfort and convenience and welfare of the people and to protect

them from careless or negligent use of dangerous substances, Therefore

Section 1. Be it ordained and enacted by the Town Council of the Borough of Reynoldsville, Pa. assembled, and it is hereby ordained and enacted by authority of the same, that in addition to any power conferred upon any public officer of said Borough, the street committee shall have and is given the supervision and control over all electric conductors now in use or which may hereafter be used in said Borough, including all telegraph, telephone, trolley and other lines, wires and instruments in which electricity is used upon any and all public streets, lanes or alleys or within public or private buildings.

Sec. 2. The Street Committee shall have direction of the construction and operation of all wires, instruments, apparatus and work used or intended for power and light in the interior of all buildings, public and private and on the streets, lanes and alleys and shall have supervision of every wire and the manner of placing the same within any building, street, lane or alley designed to carry and supply electric light or power current and shall have the right to prohibit and forbid the use of any wire, light, power, instrument or apparatus, which shall be defective, dangerous or insecure, either in material, workmanship or construction for operation and for such and every inspection of any building, street, lane or alley, in which such light or power shall be placed, the said committee shall charge for the use of said Borough and collect from the owner or owners of such building a fee not exceeding one (\$1.00) dollar.

Sec. 3. The said Street Committee shall notify the person, firm or corporation owning or operating any wire or lines, whenever the attachments, insulators, supports or appliances are unsuitable or unsafe and insufficient and if the same shall not be corrected and remedied within forty-eight hours after notice, the said Street Committee shall cause the same to be forthwith removed at the expense of such individual, firm or corporation and shall also require all abandoned or dead wires wherever found to be removed and upon failure or refusal by any such person or firm or corporation to pay the same, the said Street Committee shall enforce its payment by proper action at law in the name and for the use of the Borough of Reynoldsville.

Sec. 4. The said Street Committee shall have the right and it is made its duty to prescribe from time to time, reasonable rules and regulations for carrying out and enforcing the provisions of this ordinance and not inconsistent herewith, such rules and regulations to be approved by Council, and shall have the right to enforce the same as well as the provisions of this ordinance through such person or persons as shall from time to time be required, authorized and appointed so to do.

Sec. 5. Any person, firm or corporation violating or failing to comply with any of the provisions of this ordinance or with any of the rules and regulations, which shall from time to time be made by the said Street Committee and approved by Council as aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty of not less than ten (\$10.00) dollars, and not exceeding twenty-five (\$25.00) dollars, which shall be enforced and recovered summarily before any Justice of the Peace or Magistrate within said Borough as other fines and penalties are now by law collectable and all such fines and penalties shall be by such Justices of the Peace or Magistrate paid to the Treasurer of the Borough and in addition thereto, the person so offending shall be liable for all the costs and expenses incurred by said Borough, in enforcing any of the provisions of this ordinance or of the rules and regulations aforesaid and which may be enforced by an action of assumpsit before any Justice of the Peace or Magistrate or Court of Common Pleas having jurisdiction thereof.

Sec. 6. Council reserves the right to amend, revise or repeal the provisions of this ordinance at any time after the period of two years from the time it becomes a law.

Sec. 7. That any ordinance or part of ordinance conflicting with the provisions of this ordinance be and the same is hereby repealed so far as the same affects this ordinance.

(No. 41)

AN ORDINANCE granting to the Reynolds Electric Light, Heat and Power Company, the right to enter upon the streets, lanes and alleys of the Borough of Reynoldsville, for the purpose of laying and maintaining its wires, cables, conduits, tubes and conductors through, under and across the said streets, lanes and alleys and for the purpose of erecting poles thereon to support and maintain its wires where not buried.

Sec. 1. Be it ordained and enacted by the Town Council of the Borough of Reynoldsville assembled, and it is hereby ordained and enacted by the authority of the same, that the Reynolds Electric Light, Heat and Power Company, a corporation created and organized under the laws of Pennsylvania, be and is hereby granted the privilege and right to enter upon the highways, streets, lanes and alleys of the Borough of Reynoldsville, for the purpose of laying, placing, constructing and maintaining thereon and therein, its wires, cables, conduits, tubes and other apparatus necessary for the conducting, conveying and transmission of electricity for electric light, power, current, telegraph and telephone purposes, subject to all the provisions of general ordinances now in process of passage before the Council, being ordinances Nos. 39 and 40, and being general ordinances relating to the entry upon, use and occupation of the highways of the Borough of Reynoldsville by any firm, corporation or individual to construct a line of telegraph, telephone, electric light or electric railway poles in or upon any street, lane or alley or public square of the Borough of Reynoldsville, and relating to the erection, use, operation, construction and inspection of wires used for electrical purposes, providing for the inspection and supervision of the same upon streets, lanes or alleys and within buildings, and providing regulations pertaining thereto, provided such company shall within thirty days after the pas-

sage and approval of this ordinance, file in the office of the Secretary of the Council, certificate of acceptance of all the conditions and provisions of said general ordinance and which certificate of acceptance shall be executed under the corporate seal of such Company, duly attested by the president and secretary thereof.

Sec. 2. That in consideration of the aforesaid grant the Reynolds Electric Light, Heat and Power Company is hereby required to pay into the Borough Treasury the sum of 50 cents for each and every pole, per annum.

Sec. 3. That this permission is granted on the condition that the said Reynolds Electric Light Heat and Power Company have its plant, work or works fully completed and in operation in one year from the date of the approval of this ordinance, a failure to do so is to be taken and deemed a full and complete forfeiture of all rights and privileges granted by this ordinance.

Sec. 4. That this permission is granted on the condition that the rights and privileges granted by this ordinance to Reynolds Electric Light Heat and Power Company are not assignable to any other person, firm or corporation, without the approval by resolution duly passed of the Town Council of the Borough of Reynoldsville.

Sec. 5. That any ordinance or part of ordinance conflicting with the provisions of this ordinance be and the same is hereby repealed so far as the same affects this ordinance.
