A Klondyke "Clean-Up."

In the Century John Sidney Webb describes "The River Trip to the Klon-In telling of his visit to the El dike." Dorado mines, the author says: The uice-boxes are made of boards, machine or ship sawed, and roughly nailed up into troughs or boxes, and fitted tother like stovepipes. Cleats are naildinto the last boxes, called "riffies," or, in some instances, shallow auger-The boxes are then set up in line on a entie slope, and the pay dirt is shoveld in at the top, and a stream of water, controlled by a dam, sluices over the dirt and gold. The weight of gold is so great that it falls, and the dirt and use se gravel washes off, the gold being caught upon the cleats or in the holes scattered about. In the last boxes quicksliver is put in to eatch the very gold. When the gold is taken boxes it is called a "clean-up." On the day I was there (Aug. 17), at No. 80 El Dorado twenty thousand dollars "cleaned up" in twenty-four hours, with only one man shoveling in the lift. 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


