INDUSTRIAL NOTES.

Germany Imports Many Tons of Logs-A Novel Order for Porcelain Factory.

Our consular agent at Eibenstock, Germany, Mr. Harris, states that in 1890 2,000,000 tons of logs were imported into Germany. In 1898 3,000,000 tons were imported, or an increase of 33 1-3 per cent. During this same period sawed lumber increased from 1,200,000 tons to 2,200,000 tons, or an increase of about 100 per cent. Sawmill increase of about 100 per cent. owners of the German empire are be-ginning to agitate in favor of a higher tariff on sawed lumber.

A porcelain factory in Graefenthal, Germany, has received an order from England for 5,000 dozen figures repre-senting a wounded British soldier, with bandaged head, standing up erect, gun in hand, ready to face the approaching enemy despite his wounds. A second enemy despite his wounds. A second order is for a number of British soldiers standing by their guns pointed at the enemy.

Referring to the shell factory of the Boers recently destroyed at Johannes-burg, the Electrician, of London, states

burg, the Electrician, of London, states that all the machinery in the plant was driven by electric power, and that originally it was the largest engineering works of the kind in South Africa, the machinery alone having cost \$400,000.

A branch of the American Handle Factory of Knoxville, Tenn., located at West Point, Miss., has completed a new plant, with a capacity of 200 dozen handles a day. Among the first orders is one from a Liverpool firm for 2,000 dozen handles to be used by the British government in South Africa.
