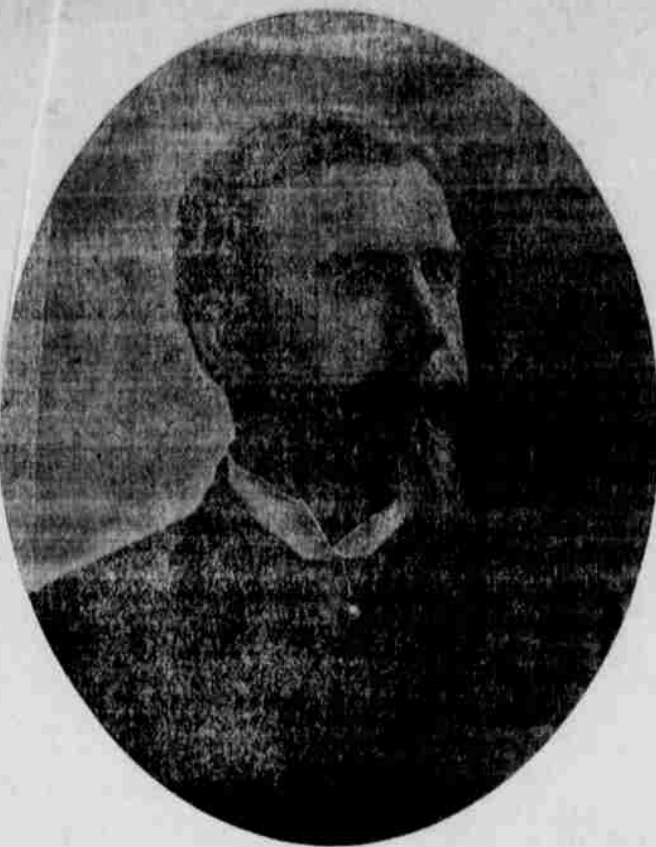

Eighty-First Anniversary.

The celebration of the 81st anniversary of Odd Fellowship in America at Brookville Thursday last, by the North-western Anniversary Association, attracted a large number of members from the eight counties composing the district, a good representation from this place visiting the county seat that day. The first thing on the program was a parade of the members in regalia, which was followed by a public meeting in Marlin's opera house, addressed by Burgess Barr, of Brookville, Rev. D. A. Platt, of Brookwayville, Grand Marshal James S. Montgomery, of Philadelphia, and Grand Master Esau Loomis, of Lancaster. The speeches were all brief, crisp and to the point and entertaining to all. While the delegates were in business session at the L. O. O. F. hall a special session of Grand Lodge was held in the opera house by Grand Lodge officers for admission of 77 Past Grands, who were also given the Past Grands' degree. The famous degree staff of Tona Lodge, Bradford, conferred the Initiatory, first and second degrees in the opera house in the evening and Lady Winslow Lodge's degree staff conferred the Rebekah degree in the hall. The next anniversary will be celebrated at Erie.
