

Ordinances.

(No. 20.)

AN ORDINANCE to amend Section 6 of Ordinance entitled "No. 3 relating to the adoption and regulation of streets, alleys and sidewalks, and to take effect and stand in force until and to take effect and stand in force until and to take effect after May 1st, 1891."

Be it ordained by the Burgess and Town Council of the Borough of West Reynoldsburg and it is hereby ordained by the authority of the same:

The section 6th of an Ordinance entitled "No. 3 relating to the adoption and regulation of streets, alleys and sidewalks," approved, and to take effect on and after March 1st, 1890, which reads as follows:

"The width of an street, or walk, drawn from the creek on line adjoining Reynoldsburg Borough west to Broadway street, shall be six feet wide, thence to Brown street, shall be five feet four inches in width, thence to west line of the borough, four feet wide, and on Broadway street sidewalk shall be five feet and four inches wide, and on all other streets shall be four feet in width; the said side walks to have an inclination of one inch in twenty feet, the plank nor to be less than two inches in thickness, and shall be laid cross ways and well spalled upon stones or timber foundations or supports, at a distance of every five and one-third feet, sufficient to keep each line of stringers of a grade, and the two transverse lines of stringers to be so laid as to meet in the middle, and at every joint of the outside stringer shall be attached together by having a coupling board one inch thick and three feet long, same width as stringer, well spalled, cut on one side, and well secured upon three sound sawed stringers, to be so laid as to break joints, and at every joint of the outside stringer, two inches apart, together, and in a manner to make one inch thick and three feet long, same width as the stringers, well spalled to each end on the inside of each of the outside lines of the stringers. The said stringers to be placed upon stones or timber foundations or supports, at a distance of every five and one-third feet, sufficient to keep each line of stringers of a grade, and the two outside lines of stringers to be not more than two inches from the end of the plank."

All new streets or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith be and the same are hereby repealed.

TO EMPOWER the proper officers of the borough of West Reynoldsburg to make a contract with the Reynoldsburg Water Company to furnish and maintain fire plugs and to supply the borough with sufficient water for the extinguishment of fires and other public purposes and to levy and collect a special annual tax to pay the expense thereof.

Section 1. Be it ordained by the Burgess and Town Council of the borough of West Reynoldsburg, and it is hereby ordained by authority of the same: That the borough of West Reynoldsburg, by its proper officers, make and enter into a contract with the Reynoldsburg Water Company to furnish and to supply the said borough with a sufficient supply of water for the extinguishment of fires and other public purposes.

Section 2. An annual annual tax be levied and collected not to exceed eight mills on each dollar of valuation of the said borough to defray the expenses of the said fire plugs and water, and that tax so levied and collected shall not be used for any other or different purpose.
