### Soft Coal Market.

(Coal Trade Journal.)

Soft coal continues in strong position, for the tonnage has been none too great at any point of production, west, south or east, and in some places the better grades are scarce. It is hoped the resumption of many men who have been idle will put an easier tone on the market conditions and give the opportunity for shipping to be resumed, so that business may move along in its usual channel.

At Buffalo the soft coal market shows some improvement, but many of the shippers are still suffering from their inability to get enough coal to supply the demand. The labor troubles which are affecting the railroad here, with the danger of a strike of the switchmen and trainmen, is another factor which is causing considerable worry among the trade. If a strike occurs it will cause considerable annoyance to the manufacturers here as there is not a large surplus of coal on hand.

The report that the Buffalo, Rochester & Pittsburg has formed a close traffic alliance with the Baltimore & Ohio is looked upon in some quarters here as an indication that the latter road will eventually require control of the former.

By others it is believed to be simply a traffic arrangement which might eventually bring to the market some of the West Virginia coal.

T. M. Kurtz, of Foxsawney, has leased about 4,000 acres of coal land in South Mahoning township, Indiana county. The work of drilling has been begun, with a view of testing the coal.

The purchase price of the tract in Indiana county, recently acquired by the Buffalo, Rochester & Pittsburg company, is said to have been \$500,000.

### Reduced Rates to Wilkesbarre.
