

### REVIEW OF TRADE.

New Conditions of Business Involve a Change of Figures-The Iron and Steel Situation.

R. G. Dun & Co.'s "Weekly Review of Trade" says: Business is not what was a year ago, but men do not agree a defining the difference. In place o he wild speculation in securities which swelled exchanges a year ago there has tome such liquidation that 20 preferred industrial stocks have sold this week at prices averaging \$83.14 per share, though the same stocks sold in April last year for \$90.66 per share, and 20 common have sold this week for \$38.40 which sold last year at \$25600 double which sold last year at \$76.09, double the price. Yet many of these com-panies have earned and paid good dividends and all have enjoyed a year of extraordinary business. The indusextraordinary business. The indus-trials have reached the lowest average they have ever known, while the 60 most active railway stocks, though depressed about \$4 per share since early oressed about 54 per share since early in April, are higher now than in most of January or February, higher than early in December and higher than a year ago. Business in some lines has ween hindered by the holding of prices so high as to check consumption. The closing of works by the Steel and Wire Company, followed by the reduction of \$20 per ton in prices of its products; the closing of many paper mills bethe closing of many paper mills be-cause of over production; the sudden reduction of 70 cents per 100 pounds in lead from the price to which it was raised late in December: the report that it plate works may be closed a while for similar reasons, create a feel-ing that some business no longer has the generating influence of the guarding and guiding influence of prices answering quickly to the demand for consumption. But progress toward a healthy adjustment has been rapid within the past week. Transactions at Pittsburg in Bessemer pig seem to be within the past week. Transactions at Pittsburg in Bessemer pig seem to be largely at guaranteed prices, so that definite quotations are avoided, though much Bessemer from the Fast is of-fered at very low figures. Grey forge is a shade lower there and local cake at Chicago, while No. 1 Lehigh is onoted at \$21,50 here. Bars sell at Philadelphia for \$1.75, while the Pitts-burg association reaffirms its mota-tions of 2 cents, which is shaded. Plates also sell there at 1.7 cents, with 1.75 quoted at Philadelphia. The demand for structural atd other products has been much reduced in part by building strikes. The move-ment of grain continues large, corn still rivaling wheat in quan-tity exported. Atlantic exports of wheat in three weeks of May have been, flour included, 8,232,041 bushels against 7,016,540 last year, and Pacific exports 2,203,000 against 1,367,006 last year, while exports of corn in the same weeks have been 10,352,958 hushels against 6,014,446 last year.



#### Blind People.

co far as the most recent statistics go, the known proportion of blind people is about one in fifteen hundred, which would give a total of one million blind in the world. The largest proportion is found in Russia, which has in Europe 200,000 blind in a population of 96,000,000, or one in 480. Most of these are found in the northern provinces of Finland, and the principal causes is ophthalmia, due to bad ventilation of the huts of the peasantry and the inadequate facilities for treatment. There is a great deal of blindness in Egypt, due to glowing sand.
