Ordinance No. 69.

AN ORDINANCE Granting to A. J. Davis, or his successors and assigns, the right to construct, maintain and operate an Electric Street Railway Line in the Borough of Reynoldsville, County of Jefferson and State of Pennsylvania:

Section 1. That authority be and is hereby given to A. J. Davis, or his successors and assigns, to construct, maintain and operate a double or single track street railway over, upon and along the following named street in the borough of Reynoldsville, to-wit: On Main street from the west end to the limits of the borough at the east end, provided the line be extended to Big Soldier and Sykesville and to Eleonora.

Section 2. That the said A. J. Davis or his successors and assigns, shall have the right to enter upon, use and occupy a reasonable and necessary portion of said street as set forth in this ordinance for the purpose of laying and constructing tracks, maintaining and operating an electric street railway thereon for the use and accommodation of the traveling public.

Section 3. That in constructing said railway the said A. J. Davis or his successors and assigns shall do no damage to public or private property and inside the use of streets as little as possible to public travel.

Section 4. The said A. J. Davis or his successors and assigns shall be and is hereby bound to lay out, grade, construct, maintain and operate the tracks of said railway of a standard width or gauge between the rails and in such a manner that the rails shall be firmly secured to the surface of the road or street on which the track or tracks is laid. The rails to be used shall be of the best quality and shall be so laid that no damage or hindrance as possible to wagons or other vehicles in passing over said track or tracks or rails.

Section 5. All rails shall be laid to conform with the surface of the street and so much of the road or street as may be between the rails and for a distance of ten feet on each side thereof shall be put and kept in such good repair and condition as the same may have been when the laying of the rails was commenced. In case the street or any portion thereof shall be paved from curb to curb or otherwise improved at any time during the life of this ordinance, said A. J. Davis or his successors and assigns shall forthwith pay the cost of paving or improving said street in like manner between the rails, and for one foot on the outside of rails and shall keep the same in good order and repair as the remainder of the street is kept by the borough authorities. The space between the ties and for four inches on the top of the ties shall be filled, tamped and ballasted with good suitable gravel. The ballast in the center of the track shall be even with the top of the rails and the rails and to the outside of all rails there shall be placed and kept sound white oak plank six inches wide and not less than three inches in thickness, firmly spiked and spiked blocks secured to all ties in such manner as to make an easy grade from the road or street to the top of the rails and at such an angle as the borough council may approve. Also all cross walks shall be kept in good order and repair at all times as may be directed by the town council. That all tracks shall be constructed upon the grade to be established by the borough council and in case of alteration of grade of the street the said A. J. Davis or his successors and assigns shall forthwith at his or their cost and expense make the tracks to conform to the new grade.

Section 6. That said A. J. Davis or his successors and assigns may trim such trees as may be required for the successful erection of the necessary poles and the stringing of the wires and maintaining the same, under the supervision of the borough council. That all tracks shall be constructed upon the grade to be established by the borough council and in case of alteration of grade of the street the said A. J. Davis or his successors and assigns shall forthwith at his or their cost and expense make the tracks to conform to the new grade.

Section 7. The said A. J. Davis or his successors and assigns shall fully indemnify the borough of Reynoldsville for all damages and costs which may be occasioned by carelessness of his or their employees in constructing, maintaining or operating said electric railway and in case of a suit against the said A. J. Davis or his successors and assigns shall appear and defend the same when notified of such action or suit by the borough of the borough. That if the said A. J. Davis or his successors and assigns shall at any time after the construction of said railway cease to operate the same and to run cars thereon for a period of three months at any one time, (except for unavoidable causes and necessary delays for repairs and alterations) then the said A. J. Davis or his successors and assigns shall forfeit the rights herein granted and shall remove said tracks and put the street in the same good condition and repair for public use as before, should the borough council by ordinance so enact and upon default thereof the borough authorities shall do the same at the expense of said A. J. Davis or his successors and assigns. That this ordinance shall be holding on the above named street for a period of ninety-nine years.

Section 8. That the said A. J. Davis or his successors and assigns, in consideration of this ordinance shall erect on and along the aforesaid street at intervals of not more than 300 feet such lights as may be necessary to properly light the roadway of said street railway within the borough limits and at such places as may be jointly agreed by the said A. J. Davis or his successors and assigns and the borough council; that neither said borough council nor the borough shall in any way be liable to any expense for said lighting; and as a further consideration, he, the said A. J. Davis, his successors and assigns shall erect, maintain and operate a street passenger railway along said Main street as mentioned, within one year from the date of this ordinance, and from said eastern borough line, to Rathmel, Big Soldier, Sykesville and Eleonora, Pa., within two years from the date hereof.

Section 9. That the said A. J. Davis or his successors and assigns shall have the right at all times to carry the United States mails, revenue, carry and deliver express packages, baggage and freight within the borough herein mentioned.

Section 10. Work in good faith shall commence and be completed one year from the date of this ordinance on said railway in the borough of Reynoldsville and the railway from the said eastern line of said borough to Rathmel, Big Soldier, Sykesville and Eleonora, shall be fully completed within two years from the date of this ordinance.

Section 11. In case the said railway is not completed within the time specified herein, then and in that case this ordinance and the franchise hereby granted, shall, at the option of the said borough, be considered forfeited and become null and void of no effect.
