Ordinance No. 66.

AN ORDINANCE Granting to A. J. Davis, or his successors and assigns, the right to construct, maintain and operate an Electric Street Railway Line in the Borough of Reynoldsville, County of Jefferson and State of Pennsylvania.

Be it enacted and ordained by the Burgess and town council of the borough of Reynoldsville, and it is hereby enacted and ordained by authority of the same:

Section 1. That the authority be and is hereby given to A. J. Davis, or his successors and assigns, to construct, maintain and operate a double or single track street railway over, upon and along the following named street in the borough of Reynoldsville, to-wit: On Main street from the west end to the limits of the borough at the east end, and to extend the same to Big Soldier and Reynoldsville and to Eleonora.

Section 2. That the said A. J. Davis or his successors and assigns, shall have the right to enter upon, use and occupy a reasonable and necessary portion of said streets set forth in section one of this ordinance, for the purpose of laying and constructing tracks, maintaining and operating an electric street railway thereon for the use and accommodation of the traveling public.

Section 3. That in constructing said railway the said A. J. Davis or his successors and assigns, shall do no damage to public or private property and impede the use of streets as little as possible to the traveling public.

Section 4. That the said A. J. Davis or his successors and assigns shall lay and keep the tracks of said railway of a standard width or gauge but not less than the width of the street on which the tracks shall be laid. The rails shall be laid on the surface of the road or street on which the track or tracks shall be laid. The rails shall be "T" rails and such as shall do as little damage or hindrance as possible to wagons or other vehicles in passing over said track or tracks or rails.

Section 5. All rails shall be laid to conform with the surface of the street and so much of the road or street as may be in such a position and for twelve inches on each side thereof shall be put and kept in such good repair and condition as the same may have been when the laying of the rails was commenced. In case the street or any portion thereof shall be paved from curb to curb or otherwise improved at any time during the life of this ordinance, said A. J. Davis or his successors and assigns shall forthwith pay the cost of paving or improving said street in like manner between the rails, and for one foot on the outside of rails and shall keep the same in as good order and repair as the remainder of the street as laid by the borough council.

The space between the ties and for four inches on the top of the ties shall be filled, tamped and fastened with such suitable gravel. The ballast in the center of the track shall be made and kept even with the top of the rails and to the outside of all rails there shall be placed and kept sound white oak plank six inches wide and not less than three inches in thickness, firmly spiked to wedge-shaped blocks secured to all ties in such manner as to make an easy grade from the road or street to the top of the rails or tracks and at such an angle as the borough council may approve. Also all cross-ways shall be kept in good order and repair at all times as may be directed by the town council, and that the burgess and town council shall have the right to decide, where the track or tracks shall be laid; whether in the center or on the side of the street, which information shall be communicated to A. J. Davis or his successors and assigns within five days after a written request for such information has been filed with the burgess of said borough.

Section 6. That said A. J. Davis or his successors and assigns may trim such trees as may be required for the success or erection of the necessary poles and the stringing of the wires and maintaining the same, under the supervision of the borough council. That all tracks shall be constructed upon the grade to be established by the borough council and in case of alteration of grade of the said street the said A. J. Davis or his successors and assigns shall forthwith at his or their cost and expense make the tracks to conform to the new grade.

Section 7. The said A. J. Davis or his successors and assigns shall fully indemnify the borough of Reynoldsville for all damages and costs which may be occasioned by carelessness of his or their employees in constructing, maintaining or operating said electric railway and in case of a suit against the borough of Reynoldsville, the said A. J. Davis or his successors and assigns shall appear and defend the same when notified of such action or suit by the burgess of the borough. That if the said A. J. Davis or his successors and assigns shall at any time after the construction of said railway cease to operate the same and to run cars thereon, for a period of three months at any one time (except for unavoidable causes and necessary delays for repairs and alterations) then the said A. J. Davis or his successors and assigns shall forfeit the rights herein granted and shall remove said tracks and put the street in the same good condition and repair for public use as before the construction of said railway and the borough council, under the supervision of the borough council, shall have the right to remove said tracks and put the street in the same good condition and repair for public use as before the construction of said railway and the borough council, under the supervision of the borough council, shall have the right to remove said tracks and put the street in the same good condition and repair for public use as before the construction of said railway.

Section 8. That the said A. J. Davis or his successors and assigns shall be held liable in any way he may be liable to any expense for said lighting and as a further consideration, he, the said A. J. Davis, his successors and assigns, shall erect, maintain and operate a street passenger railway along said Main street as mentioned, within one year from the date of this ordinance, and from said eastern borough line, to Rathmel, Big Soldier, Skylesville and Eleonora, Pa., within two years from the date hereof.

Section 9. That the said A. J. Davis or his successors and assigns shall have the right at all times to use the streets of the borough to receive, carry and deliver express packages, baggage and freight within the borough herein mentioned.

Section 10. Work in good faith shall commence and be completed one year from the date of this ordinance on said railway in the borough of Reynoldsville, and the same shall be completed within two years from the date of this ordinance.

Section 11. In case the said railway is not completed within the time specified herein, and in that case this ordinance and the franchise hereby granted, shall, at the option of the said borough, be considered forfeited and become null and void and of no effect.
