A complete commercial course, stenographic course, book keeping, complete teachers' course, coal mining, mechanical drawing, telegraphy and 60 other courses are taught by this school. The winner of this prize can take up a \$35.00 course or can have the \$35.00 applied as part pay on any course the winner may select.

The person getting the second highest number of votes can have their choice of the scholarship in Kings' School of Oratory or the International Correspondence Schools.

PREMIUM COUPONS—Persons paying their back subscription, or in advance one year or more,

On April 30, 1901, the Pennsylvania Railroad Company placed on sale summer excursion tickets to Buffalo on account of the Pan-American Exposition, and to Niagara Falls.
