Reynoldsville Business Men Interested in Operating Zinc Mine in Missouri.

About two years ago some of our business men were induced to take stock in a company that was being organized to operate for zinc in Missouri and they bought a large interest near Carthage, Mo. After a few months had slipped by there were doubts in the minds of some of those interested as to whether the investment was worth anything or not.

The first week in May J. J. Sutter, one of our merchants, who is a stockholder in the zinc mine, went out to Missouri to see the mine and to form some idea for himself of the plant and its value.

In conversation with Mr. Sutter one day last week we learned the following facts concerning the company and the zinc mine they are now operating.

The name of company is the Plymouth Rock Mining Company, composed of J. Van Reed, A. T. McClure, F. D. Smith, Dr. J. C. King, Dr. W. B. Alexander, W. W. Wiley, G. O. Switzer, G. J. Corwin, J. J. Sutter, of Reynoldsville, Dr. R. M. Boyle and J. C. Boyle, of Falls Creek, and Mr. Cook, of Carthage. The company owns five acres of land. The mine is 196 feet deep and the ore is brought to the surface in an iron tub that holds 500 pounds.

Three steam drills are used in mine, but for the comfort of the miners these machines are operated with compressed air. The men drill all day and the blasting is done after men quit work in the evening. The mine is not opened enough yet to run full capacity, but the output is about one hundred tons a day in the rough. It requires as much water to wash the ore as it would to run a grist mill. The company sells the zinc at plant for \$32.50 per ton. On the 24th of May they shipped 109,470 pounds. Mr. Sutter had a box of ore shipped home, which arrived here last week, that is 40 per cent zinc. He says all the ore from their mine does not contain quite as much per cent of zinc as the ore he brought home with him, but this ore is a fair average specimen of the ore can be seen at Seeley, Alexander & Co. bank, First National bank or at Mr. Sutter's dry goods store.

Died in Sykesville.

Mrs. Margaret Duff died at the home of her daughter, Mrs. John H. Null, at Sykesville, May 24, 1902, in the 78th year of her age. Five years ago, soon after her husband's death, Mrs. Duff accidentally fell down the cellar steps at the home of Mr. Null and broke her left hip and was a sufferer and invalid from time of accident until her death. She was the widow of Alexander Duff. She was a sister of Henry Brown, who died at his home at Bell's Mills nine days before Mrs. Duff's death. She was born in Westmoreland county, Pa., February 15, 1825, and was married to Alexander Duff in 1847. Mr. and Mrs. Duff moved to Bell township in 1856 and after residing there a number of years they moved to Henderson township, where they lived 17 years and then moved back to Bell township. Mrs. Duff was the mother of eight children, six of whom survive her. They are L. H. Duff, of Punxsutawney, James A. and A. M. Duff, of Luthersburg, H. B. Duff, of Pitsaun, Mrs. S. C. Ricard, of Toledo, Ohio, Mrs. J. H. Null, of Sykesville. All her children and all, except two, of her grand children were present at the funeral, which was largely attended by her former friends and associates. Early in life she joined the Cumberland Presbyterian church at Mt. Pleasant. She was a christian woman. She passed away peacefully and calmly.

Note of Warning.

At the request of the Reynoldsville Cemetery Company we publish the law concerning the stealing of flowers from cemeteries. We are also requested to state that this company will positively enforce the law if any person is guilty of a misdemeanor in the Reynoldsville Cemetery: "Any person or persons who shall willfully and maliciously destroy, mutilate, injure, pluck off, deface or remove therefrom, any tree or trees, vines, flowers, grass or ornamental shrubbery, growing, being or temporarily placed therein, for ornamental or useful purposes, in any cemetery or graveyard in this Commonwealth used for the interment of human beings, or shall willfully trespass in and upon private inclosures in any cemetery or graveyard aforesaid, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and, on conviction of any of said offences, be sentenced to undergo an imprisonment not exceeding one year, or to pay a fine not exceeding one hundred dollars, or both, or either, at the discretion of the court."

Died at Stanton.

Edward Reitz, father of County Treasurer Gil C. Reitz, died suddenly at his home at Stanton about 7:00 a. m. Wednesday, May 28, 1902, from heart trouble. Mr. Reitz had been out all of Tuesday oversaw the work of building a new barn and had gotten up early Wednesday morning, but before breakfast laid down on lounge and fell asleep. When he got up he sank to floor and expired without speaking. Mr. Reitz was in his 71st year. He had resided at Stanton from the time he was deputy sheriff, in 1866. He was a member of the M. E. church for many years. Funeral services were held in the Stanton M. E. church Friday, conducted by the pastor, Rev. Jayquay, assisted by Rev. Joel Smith, of Beechtree, Dr. W. P. Graham, of Brookville, and Presiding Elder R. C. Smith.
