SKETCH OF JOHN L. GRAHAM.

Recently Completed the Construction of a Large Mill in Michigan.

John L. Graham, formerly of this place, son-in-law of J. H. Corbett, who is well known to a large number of Reynoldsville people, has just completed the construction of a large mill for Boyne City Lumber Co., of Boyne, Mich., and the Boyne Citizen, in a long write-up and description of the large industry, had the following to say about Mr. Graham, the builder:

"If it be true that a man may be judged by what and how he builds, we feel safe in saying that Mr. J. L. Graham is at least of a solid and substantial type. It was through his courtesy that we were shown the various departments of the mill, and we were so well pleased with the construction work that we wish to say a few words about the man before we proceed with a description of his handiwork.

Mr. Graham's knowledge of mill matters is the result of a long and constant connection with them. From his early boyhood he has lived and "learned" in an atmosphere suited to fit him for the work which he is now so successfully carrying forward as an occupation. He was born in northwestern Pennsylvania in the region of sawmills; and at the age of fourteen years had attained to

the position of filer for a small mill. His schooling consisted of a classical course in the West Sunbury Academy, Butler county, Pennsylvania, from which school he graduated at an early age. With the exception of the years spent there, he has constantly been engaged in milling and mechanical labors. For about one year he was field engineer for the South Penn. Oil Company in West Virginia, and for the past five years he has been superintending the business of C. H. Prescott & Sons of Tawas City, Michigan, from which place he came to Boyne City to act in the capacity of superintendent of construction for the Boyne City Lumber Company."
