The contract for cut ing the necessary channels was given merchants engaged, like Frederick 'udor, in the export of ice-not from he harbor. Their task was to cut, rithin the space of three days a chanel about ten miles long. For tools ney had the best machinery used in utting fresh-water ice, and horse lower was employed. The ice was rom six to twelve inches in thickness, is the Advertiser of February 2, 1844, escribed the scene: "A great many ersons have been attracted to our pharves to witness the operations and he curious spectacle of the whole haror frozen over, and the ice has been overed by skaters, sleds and even eighs. Tents and booths were erected pon the ice, and some parts of the arbor bore the appearance of a Rusian holiday scene." On February 3 he work was done, and the Britannia. teaming slowly through the lane of pen water, lined on either side by nousands of cheering spectators, made her way to the sea. 
