
Horse Fell on Woman

The Record said that Mrs. Betty McDonald was murdered in the Beechwoods on the night of February 19, 1876, the criminals split her head open with a hatchet, killing her almost instantly, that Chase was arrested at Ridgway the next day, tried and convicted, and hanged August 28, 1876. About the only correct part of the above statement is that Mrs. Betty McDonald was murdered in Beechwoods and that Chase was hung for the crime. The murder occurred on the night of February 19, 1807, not 1876; the murderers used a maul, not a hatchet; Chase was arrested near Brockwayville, not Ridgway, and was hung August 28, 1867, not 1876.


