Summerville 'Phone Improvements.

At a meeting of the directors of the Summerville Telephone Company in this place one day last week orders were issued which will result in giving Panzutaaway the best and most improved telephone service over that line now obtainable. Just as soon as the supplies can be procured, the weather permitting, the work of reconstruction will be begun. The plan to be introduced is known as the Central Energy System, the electric current being transmitted on overhead wires, differing in that respect from the present system, in that two metallic wires are used to complete the circuit whereas in the present system the ground constitutes half of it. The wires thus used are carried from one central point to another in cable formations which will be extended out of town for a mile or more. By this means noise and interruptions, caused by various influences, will be eliminated. A new switchboard will be installed in the local office with accommodations for 300 phones. The old phones will be replaced by new instruments of modern type. In this system the batteries are located in the central office and the phones are consequently not equipped with a coil box at the bottom.—Panzutaaway Spirit.

Pacific Coast and Grand Canyon.

On account of the General Conference of the Methodist Episcopal Church, to be held at Los Angeles, Cal., beginning May 3, the Pennsylvania Railroad Company will run a personally conducted tour to Los Angeles, visiting the Grand Canyon of Arizona en route, at unusually low rates. A special train of the highest grade Pullman equipment will leave New York, Philadelphia, and Pittsburg on Wednesday, April 27, running via Chicago and the Santa Fe Route to the Grand Canyon. Sunday will be spent at this wonderful place, and Los Angeles will be reached on the evening of May 2. Round-trip tickets, including transportation, one double berth, and meals on special train going; and transportation only returning on regular trains via direct routes or via San Francisco, will be sold at rate of \$106 from New York, \$105 from Philadelphia, Baltimore, and Washington, and \$100 from Pittsburg. Tickets will be good to return at any time before June 30. Tourists returning via St. Louis may stop off for ten days to visit the World's Fair, by depositing ticket and paying \$1.00 fee.
