(No. 24.) AN ORDINANCE--To amend section six of Ordinance No. 3, relating to the adoption and regulation of streets, alleys, and side-walks.

Be it ordained and enacted by the town council of the Borough of West Reynoldsville in council assembled and it is hereby ordained and enacted by the authority of the same: That section six of Ordinance No. 3 relating to the adoption and regulation of streets, alleys, and side-walks, which now reads as follows: "That all plank walks on Main street from the creek on line adjoining Reynoldsville Borough, west to Broadway street shall be six feet wide, thence to Brown street, shall be five feet four inches in width, thence to west line of the Borough, four feet wide; and on Broadway street side-walks shall be five feet four inches in width, and on all other streets shall be four feet in width; the said side-walks to have an inclination of one-fourth of an inch to the foot towards the street."

Plank shall be not less than two inches in thickness, and shall be laid crosswise and well spiked upon three sound sawed stringers, to be not less than 3x5 inches, said stringers to be so laid as to break joints, and at every joint of the outside stringer they shall be attached together by having a coupling board one inch thick and three feet long, same width as said stringers, well spiked to each end on the inside of each of the outside lines of stringers. The said stringers to be placed upon stone or timber foundations or supports, at a distance of every five and one-third feet, sufficient to keep each line of stringers of a grade, and the two outside lines of stringers to be not more than two inches from the end of the plank, and the same is hereby amended so that it shall read as follows:

Section Six. That all side-walks on Main street from the creek on line adjoining Reynoldsville Borough west to Broadway street shall be six feet wide; that all side-walks on line of lots abutting upon the following named streets, viz., Main, Ohio, Powers, Central, Warner, Arms, Baxter, First Avenue, Second Avenue, Water, Broadway, Brown, Lewis, Erie, shall be five feet, four inches in width; the said side-walks to have an inclination towards the street of one-fourth of an inch to the foot. The plank, when used, shall be not less than two inches in thickness, and shall be laid crosswise and well spiked upon three sound sawed stringers, to be not less than 3x5 inches, said stringers to be so laid as to break joints, and at every joint of the outside stringer they shall be attached by a coupling board one inch thick and three feet long, same width as the said stringers, well spiked to each end on the inside of each of the outside lines of stringers. The said stringers to be placed upon stone or timber foundations or supports, at a distance of every five and one-third feet, sufficient to keep each line of stringers of a grade, and the outside lines of stringers to be not more than two inches from the end of the plank, and the inside lines of said side-walks shall correspond with the lines of owners of property abutting upon the said several streets.

AND WHEREAS, On the 15th day of June, A. D., 1904, T. E. Evans submitted the following bid, to wit: Reynoldsville, Pa., June 15, 1904. To the Town Council, Reynoldsville Borough: I submit the following bid for paving Main street as per plans and specifications: Grading per cubic yard, 28 cents; paving, complete, per square yard, stone or gravel, \$1.16; setting and furnishing curb, per lineal foot, 30 cents. The above prices are for the Reynoldsville Clay Manufacturing Company's brick, wire cut.

Yours truly, T. E. EVANS. AND WHEREAS, The said T. E. Evans has agreed, with the Council, to use in said paving, at the above specified prices, wire cut paving block, one-half of the required number to be manufactured by the Reynoldsville Clay Manufacturing Company and one-half to be manufactured by the Reynoldsville Brick and Tile Manufacturing Company. Now, THEREFORE, Be it ordained and enacted by the Town Council of the Borough of Reynoldsville, Pa., and it is hereby ordained and enacted by authority of the same:

1. That the bid of T. E. Evans, above recited, be and the same is hereby accepted, (wire cut paving block to be used of the manufacture above stated.)

2. The bond of the said T. E. Evans with sureties, as filed with the Clerk of Council, is hereby approved.

3. James B. Caldwell, Esq., of Brookville, Pa., is hereby designated as engineer in charge of said work.

4. Payments shall be made to the said T. E. Evans, at the end of each period of two weeks on all work done and materials furnished by him during the preceding two weeks, on estimates to be furnished by the engineer in charge.

5. Final payment shall be made to the said T. E. Evans within thirty days after the completion of the work in accordance with the plans and specifications, the amount of the balance due to be ascertained by actual measurements to be made by the engineer in charge, in accordance with the provisions relating to such measurement contained on Ordinance No. 91.
