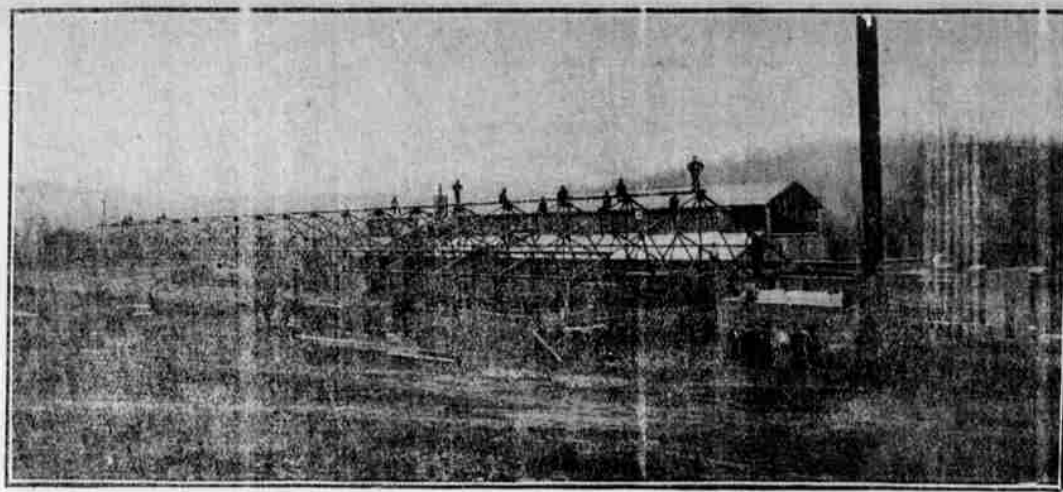

THE AMERICAN PRODUCTION COMPANY'S PLANT IS NOW NEARING COMPLETION.

Forty Men are now Employed and when in Full Operation About Three Hundred Men will be Required.—Much work has been done Already and Shipments made to Customers.—Some of the Articles Manufactured.

It is possible that a large number of our citizens do not fully realize and appreciate the fact that the plant being put in by the American Production Company, known as the steel plant, will be the best industry in Reynoldsville when it is in full operation, as it will give employment to about 300 men.
