Bee Keepers Convention.
The second annual convention of the
Pennsylvania State Bee Keepers Assoca-
tion met at State College, Pa.,
Thursday and Friday, March 29 and 30.
The meetings were held in the college
buildings. About forty of the more
prominent bee keepers of the state were
present and a good degree of interest
was shown by the farmers and citizens
of that place. Two of the "high lights
of beeedom" were present in the persons
of E. R. Root, of Medina, Ohio, editor
of *Gleanings in Bee Culture*, and E. F.
Phillips, Ph. D., assistant entomologist
of the U. S. in charge of apiculture
Washington, D. C.
Mr. Root delivered a very interesting
address on Friday afternoon on candied
honey, showing that the solidifying of
extracted honey is a good evidence of
its purity. Honey adulterated with
glucose will candy, but is much slower
in the process. This address was fol-
lowed by state chemist Dr. Freer on
"The Chemical Composition of Honey,"
which was very instructive. Friday
evening was devoted largely to an
illustrated lecture by Dr. Phillips. The
first part of his lecture described the
art of queen rearing in all its details;
the second part, the anatomy of the bee,
was instructive in a high degree to all
interested in nature as well as to the
bee keeper. The president of the
association is Prof. H. A. Surace,
economic zoologist of Pennsylvania. He
is an able man, and is using all his
influence towards securing needed legis-
lation along apicultural lines. All
interested in apiculture would do well
to look into the merits of this associa-
tion. It will in the near future be a
prominent factor in the securing of pure
food laws, which will be for common
good of all.

The convention adjourned Friday
evening at 11.30 to meet at Altoona,
Pa., next fall; time to be set by the
executive committee.
