ORDINATION ANNIVERSARY.

Father T. Brady Given Reception and Valuable Presents.

Mention was made in THE STAR last week that Tuesday, May 29th, was the twenty-fifth anniversary of Father Torrence Brady's ordination into the priesthood, but on account of going to press early Tuesday evening to give the office force a vacation Decoration Day, we were unable to give any particulars of the reception given to Father Brady Tuesday evening.

The reception was held in the parochial school hall, there was a large crowd present and it proved to be a very pleasant and profitable reception for Father Brady and an exceedingly enjoyable occasion for all those who were present. P. A. Hardman presided and introduced the speakers and proved himself a capable man for that position. Lawyer Clement W. Flynn, in his smooth and eloquent way, in behalf of Father Brady's friends, presented him with \$325.00 in cash, gold headed cane and a morris chair. The chair was the gift of the school children. Father Brady responded to the presentation address. He was greatly surprised at the large sum of money presented to him, especially at this time when the miners have been on a strike eight or nine weeks. He appreciates the presents because it is an evidence to him that he has a large number of warm friends in this place.

Interesting and excellent addresses were made by Father McGivney, of DuBois, Father John Kearns, of Greenville, a former Reynoldsville boy, Father Joseph Zubrcki, of Adrian, and Father Lynch, of Reynoldsville. Members of the L. C. B. A. served refreshments.

Father Brady was born in the north of Ireland. Early in life he came to America. He graduated in St. Bonaventure College, Allegany, N. Y. He spent one year in New Bethlehem after being ordained and served the Reynoldsville Catholic church during that year, and twenty-four years ago was sent as resident pastor of the church in this place. On account of his long residence here he is known to a large circle of people and is greatly beloved by his parishioners.

The above picture of Father Brady was taken several years ago, when he was heavier than he is now, but it is the last picture he had taken. The appearance of the picture will be a surprise to him, as the photo was obtained without his knowledge or consent.

Notice to Dog Owners.

The Burgess desires every owner of a dog or dogs, residing within the limits of the borough of Reynoldsville, to bear in mind that on the first day of July, of the present year, Ordinance No. 83, formed for the prevention of the disease known as rabies, or hydrophobia, will be strictly and rigidly enforced not only as to muzzles, but collars also. On and after the first day of July, 1906, every dog within the limits of the borough of Reynoldsville, Jefferson county, whether running at large or not, must have a collar with the owner's name plainly stamped thereon and a tag, showing that he has paid a tax for said dog. Each and every dog must be muzzled at the mouth so as to prevent biting or eating, during the months of July and August. The ordinance provides for the payment of \$1.00 out of the borough treasury for the destruction and burial of each and every dog whose owner disregards this ordinance.

This notice is given in due time so that every person or persons owning a dog or dogs may be prepared to comply with the enforcement of this ordinance. Any one who is not familiar with the ordinance can be enlightened thereon by calling on the Burgess at the *Foban-ter* printing office or the city clerk at the Building and Loan Association's office.

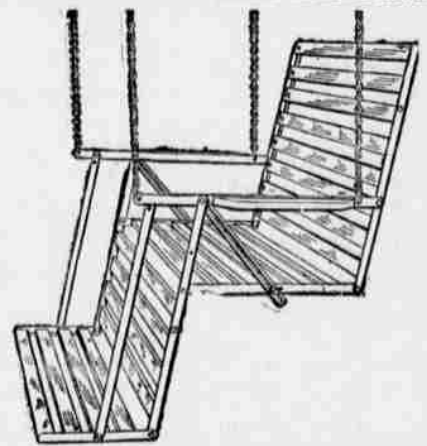

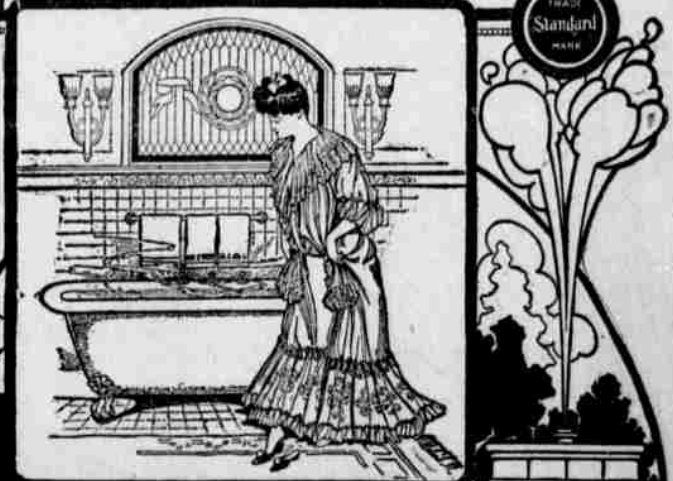
