SWEET POTATOES.

Sweet potatoes succeed best on a deep and rich sandy soil with a warm exposure. The ground should be well plowed and harrowed fine. In each hill plant two sets, covering about two inches deep and as they grow keep drawing dirt around them. They are among the very best vege-tables for table use. Select a bright clear day for digging, let them dry a day or two, then place in boxes with paper with a small quantity of slacked lime among the potatoes. Keep during winter in a store room. -Miss Bessie L. Fretwell, in The Epitomist.

Very many horses suffer with thrush, or swollen and cracked feet, often the effects of laminities, etc. The remedies given by veterinarians, consisting of standing the feet in sulphate of copper, etc., are complicated and difficult to follow.
