Mr. Hunter's Road Plan.

State Highway Commissioner Jos. W. Hunter wants a road inspector in every township in the sixty-seven counties of the state. This would mean 4,000 road inspectors in Pennsylvania, all working together for the advancement of the "good road" idea. Such a plan carried out would give a boost to our good roads movement, which has been inaugurated by Commissioner Hunter. In speaking of the plan he has in mind, Commissioner Hunter said: "Why should not road supervisors organize, just the same as the school directors in the different counties have done? Results heretofore unthought of would follow. The school directors have their regular organizations and meetings, where they talk over the latest ideas in educational matters with advantage to the public school system. "If the supervisors in every county are organized along similar lines and all the new things in road building and road improving will be thoroughly disseminated and discussed, the work of the State Department will be facilitated and aided. Those who use roads will reap advantages from organization. Altogether, I think the plan a feasible one."

Alcoholism and Consumption.

In a recent address before the American International Congress on tuberculosis, Dr. T. D. Crothers, of Hartford, Conn., the head of an institution in that city for the treatment of inebriates, took occasion to point out the close connection that existed between alcoholism and tuberculosis. The principal point presented by Dr. Crothers in his address is that alcohol weakens the blood vessels of the respiratory system and invites consumption; that the roll of consumptives receives annually vast additions from the ranks of moderate drinkers. A reduction of our national drinking capacity, therefore, means a reduction in the number of victims of the great white plague.—Philadelphia Press.
