HOW JAPS WILL WHIP US.

German Military Critic Has Future War Mapped Out.

Captain Ignaz Rodde, of the general staff of the American-Hungarian army, has published a pamphlet entitled "The Prospects of the Future American-Japanese War," in which he says the unprotected Pacific coast of the United States offers excellent chances of the success of the Japanese.

He asserts Japan is working feverishly to complete her military and naval equipments adding that during the last few months 50,000 men have been at work day and night in the arsenals, turning out guns and small arms.

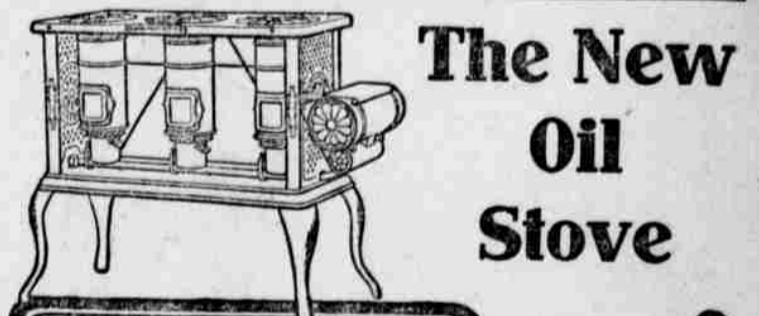
The hedgehog, guarded by spikes, rolls itself up for the winter in a hole lined with grass and moss.
