New Game Laws.

The following are now new game laws of this state, having been enacted by the present legislature and signed by the governor:

Making the open season for woodcock, pheasant and wild turkey from October 1 to December 1.

Making the open season for rabbits October 1 to December 1.

Making the open seaso, for killing deer from November 15 to December 1, and prohibiting the killing of doe

Giving additional protection to game and wild birds within the limits of "preserves" created under the act of May 11, 1905.
