ORDINANCE NO. 124.

REGULATING the manner and terms upon which the owners of property or other persons, may make connection to any public sewer, or branch thereof, in the Borough of Reynoldsville; providing for the payment of fees and how permission to make such connection can be obtained; regulating the fee to be paid to the inspector of sewers and providing a penalty for the violation of any of the rules or regulations.

Be it enacted and ordained by the Burgess and Town Council of the Borough of Reynoldsville, and it is hereby enacted and ordained by authority of same:

Sec. 1. That from and after the passage of this ordinance it shall be the duty of all persons wishing to tap into or make connection to any public sewer or branch thereof, within the jurisdiction of the Borough of Reynoldsville, to first make written application to the Clerk of Council for permission to do so, and such written application to state the premises and sewer desired to be connected. If the person making the application has not directly paid or contributed by a special assessment towards the expense of the construction of the section of the sewer for which application for permission to tap into or connect with is made, the person making such application shall pay to the Clerk of Council for the use of the Borough, a fee of twenty dollars for permission to connect with the said sewer.

Sec. 2. When application is made to the Clerk as above provided and the fee paid, if the person making application be required to pay the fee the Clerk shall notify the Sewer Inspector who shall designate the place where the connection shall be made to the public sewer, or branch thereof; and work shall be done under the supervision of the Sewer Inspector and to his satisfaction. The sewer Inspector shall be entitled to receive and demand for his services before the connection is made, a fee of seventy-five cents, which said fee shall be paid by the person making the application, and the said fee shall be payment in full to the Sewer Inspector for his services in making the connection or supervising the same.

Sec. 3. For any violation of the above rules or regulations, the person offending shall be liable to a fine not less than \$25.00 nor more than \$50.00 for each offense, to be recovered for the use of the borough as other fines and penalties are collectable by law.

Section 4. Whenever anything is forbidden or directed by the provisions of this ordinance by using the general terms, anyone, any person, the person, every person, and such person, or the relative pronoun he, referring to such general term, the same prohibition or direction, if the contrary be not expressed, is extended to more persons than one, to females as well as males, and to corporations and partnerships doing or permitting the same to be done.

Sec. 5. That any ordinance or part of ordinance conflicting with the provisions of this ordinance, be and the same are hereby repealed so far as the same effects this ordinance.

Enacted and enacted finally by the Town Council of Reynoldsville, Pennsylvania, at a regular meeting held at the Council Chamber on Tuesday, the 6th day of August, 1907, at 10:30 P. M.

Resolution Adopted by the Advisory Board of the Department of Health of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, July 25, 1907.

Resolved: That in the opinion of the Advisory Board and the Commissioner of Health, a person who has had the operation for vaccination faithfully performed three times, at intervals of two successive weeks, without success is for the time being immune from smallpox, and, further, that under the present law persons who have a written certificate from a reputable physician that two such attempts to vaccinate were faithfully performed, and a second certificate from a physician of the State Department of Health, or of a Board or Bureau of Health or Sanitary Committee of a City or Borough may be admitted to school for one year without violating the spirit of the law, the object of which is simply to prevent the spread of smallpox.

P. S. & N. FILES BILL.

Asks County Commissioners to Restrain From Enforcing a-Cent Fare Bill.

The Pittsburg, Shawmut & Northern Railroad Co., by its attorneys, Charles Corbett, Edward A. Carmalt, N. L. Strong, Edwin E. Tait, have filed in the prothonotary's office of Jefferson county, a bill in equity to restrain the county commissioners from enforcing the act of assembly of April 5, 1907, known as the two-cent fare bill. The petition of the railroad company asks the court to declare the act unconstitutional, and cites the incorporation of the company and its rights under its charter in defense of its right to continue in business without the payment of any penalty attached to a failure to comply with the law complained of. The county commissioners have accepted service of the bill, through their attorney, A. B. Stewart, and the case will be placed upon the September argument list. Frank S. Smith, as receiver for the railroad company, brings the action.—Brookwayville Record.
