Money Famine at an End.

Substantial and effective relief of the financial stringency should result from the action of the Government in deciding to sell \$50,000,000 of Panama canal bonds bearing 2 per cent interest, and to issue treasury certificates or notes to the amount of \$100,000,000, bearing 3 per cent interest. The bonds will be issued in amounts of \$20, \$100, \$1,000 and \$10,000, and will be redeemable in gold after 10 years. The certificates will run for one year and will be for \$50 each. The bonds and certificates or notes will have the credit of the Government of the United States behind them and will be the safest investment in the world. Their sale should attract into circulation money which is now being hoarded, the withdrawal of which by timid capitalists having been largely responsible for the existing financial stringency.

The President points to the fact that already \$55,000,000 of gold has been imported from abroad, and that the Government has deposited in the national banks \$60,000,000 additional. The proceeds of the bond and note sales will also be deposited. Under the circumstances the end of the money famine is in sight.

The issue of these debt certificates, in tempting denominations, will serve to unlock all the safety vaults and home hiding places for the money of alarmed investors. No one is hysterical enough to doubt the Government's honesty and solvency. No one is silly enough to hold fast to money which brings in no income when he can place it in the nation's securities with absolute safety and a fair rate of interest guaranteed.

Bring forth your money and place it in circulation and all will be well.
