An Open Letter.

To T. M. Kurtz, S. Taylor North and Henry I. Wilson, announced candidates for State Senator; James G. Mitchell, Robert H. Longell, Horace G. Miller, George H. Small and George W. Porter, announced candidates for Assembly, and any others who may later announce their candidacy for said offices:
