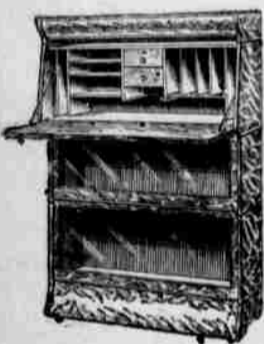

Mrs. Margaret Fye Dead.

Mrs. Margaret Hutchison Fye died at the home of her niece, Mrs. C. C. Chittester, Thursday morning at one o'clock, after a protracted illness covering several months. Ever since last October she had been suffering from nervous prostration and heart trouble. The best of care and medical attention was given her, but gradually her strength ebbed away and to the watchful friends the end was not unexpected.

Deceased was the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Thomas Hutchison, Sr., and was the youngest of a family of eight children. She was born at the old homestead, a short distance from town, where her girlhood was spent. The mother died 25 years ago and Margaret remained at home looking after the welfare of her aged father and caring for his declining years. Thirteen years ago the father departed this life and since then Margaret had made her home with her brothers and sisters.

About seven years ago Mrs. Fye united with the Brockwayville Presbyterian church and has been a devoted member and regular attendant whenever possible and as long as her health permitted.

She is survived by one daughter, Mrs. John Marshall, of Lanes Mills, and the following brothers and sisters: Mrs. M. B. Moorhead and Thomas Hutchison, of Brockwayville; Mrs. Thomas Pifer, of Wishaw; Mrs. J. A. Cooper, of Cambridge Springs, and Joseph Hutchison, of Pittsburg. Two other brothers, John, of New Bethlehem, and James, who resided here, preceded the sister to the grave.—Brockwayville Record.

Funeral services were held Saturday afternoon, conducted by Rev. Paul J. Slonaker, and interment was made in Beechwoods cemetery.
