Creek, the general contract was given to McKean Hari and Son, of Pottsville, and the actual work is under the supervision of T. D. Brewer, of West Reynoldsville.

The building contains five large school rooms, four of which, on the first and second floors, will be used at once. The other is in the basement and will be equipped when increase of students demands it. There is also a smaller room on the second floor which will probably be equipped for use as a high school later. The two main rooms on second floor will be separated by folding doors and when it is desired, these may be thrown back, making a large assembly hall for special exercises.

It will be heated by the American Warming & Ventilating Co's Improved gravity furnace system of heating and ventilation and its American down draft system of dry closets and slate urinals.

When completed, the citizens of West Reynoldsville may look with pride on this structure and know that they have a public school building which is unsurpassed by any located in a borough of its size in the state.

mediately along the west side of the river, and some grading will be commenced in a few days from the Kiskimintus up the Allegheny, no contracts will be awarded for the present over there, and real construction will not be commenced until the extension on the east side is completed.

Because of the heavy construction east of the river it will not be necessary to rush the work on the west side, and as the coal lands being purchased west of the river are simply reserve lands to insure a future tonnage, it is possible the road down that side may not be completed until the company decides to develop the lands. This may be even longer than two years, and may not be done for five years.

But the extension from Brookville to the river is to be rushed to completion as fast as money, men and machinery can do the work, and it is not probable that January 1, 1911, will see trains running to mouth of Mahoning.

This road is going to open up a vast new country, and will be the means of making Mahoning and Templeton important towns.
