Thermometers in Reynoldsville registered eight degrees below zero last Saturday morning, which is the lowest for the season thus far.

John M. Hays, mail carrier on one of the rural routes, has purchased a natty new covered sleigh.

The private car of James Buckalew, of Oil City, passed through Reynoldsville Friday and again on Saturday, attached to Pennsylvania passenger trains.

John Cottle, who has been watchman at the Star Glass Company's Plant for several years, has resigned his position and same is being filled by Herman Deible.

The Eldred Window Glass Company at Punxsutawney, is now complaining of an inadequate supply of gas. It looks much as though a gas producer would have to be installed there to profitably manufacture their product.

Rawl McMillen, a young man who formerly resided in Reynoldsville, was painfully injured at James City, near Kane, last week, while employed as a carpenter on the new plate glass plant at that place. Mr. McMillen was caught under a falling plank and was injured on side and back. He was taken to a hospital and is reported much improved.

Will Tyson narrowly escaped the loss of an eye last week through being hit on the organ with a flying piece of coal.
