And, in and by the 4th section of an Act, approved the 15th day of April, 1850, it is cancted that the 15 section of an act passed July 2d, 1829, entitled "An act relating to the elections of this Commonwealth," shall not be construed as to prevent any military or Borough officer from serving as Judge, Inspector or Clerk of any General or special elec. tion of this Commonwealth.
