ANOTHER VECC.-President Johnson has sent to the Senate his vem of the bill making Colorado a State. His reasons are ably stated, and it is certain that he does not pay much attention to the impeachment propositions.

The following sound and seasonable advice to business men, we copy from the United States Economist and Dry Goods Reporter. That journal says:

We know of no sentiment more handsome for men of business to enter upon the year with, than a deep conviction that its fortunes are very much under their own control. Much less of the ill fortune of the past year is due to the difficulties of the times than to capitalists not regulating their business intelligently to the condition of things. They act upon old rules instead of remembering that changed circumstances call for new modes of management. In nothing have manufacturers, for instance, erred so seriously during the past year as in blindly turning out all the goods they could produce, instead of first inquiring what amount the country would be likely to take at such prices as they could afford to produce them at. It is this neglect of regulating the surply to the probable demand that has caused most of the los, ses of 1866. And it must depend chiefly upon the degree to which this cardinal rule of manufacturing or merchants ing is observed, whether 1867 is a profimble or losing year. It must be taken for granted that the year will be characterized by a continuance of the difficulties which have beset business during 1866. We are in a process of a return toward lower prices. The merchant has to meet the certainty of a constant shrinkage of values, and the manufacturer to calculate upon a study decline in raw materials; so that he is constantly liable to find that he can produce goods at a lower price than he can afford to sell his stock at. This is the chief difficulty with which men of business have to contend. It inevitably reduces their profits, and this fact being well understood, there is an inclination to curtail the facilities of credit, which again constitutes an important embarrass. ment. The prudent course, under such circumstances, is to hold the lowest pos. sible stocks. Adopting that course, riks at the decline in prices are reduced, and there is a constant pressure upon production, which, acting finally upon raw materials and labor, tends directly to cause prices to approximate the normal level as nearly as the case admits of. It is principally in the observance of this very plain rule that traders and pro-ducers possess an almost absolute control over the future course of the markets.

Many are diverted from this very simple principle of regulation by imagining that Congress can legislate affairs By am't paid House of Refinto a healthier condition. By tighten ing the tariff screw and casing the tax. screw, they imagine that the whole series of commercial derangements will be remedied; and they consequently spend the time in boring Congress to tinker the tariff, which they should occupy in an intelligent effort to regulate their lessiness by the condition of affuirs around them. It is this foolish attempt to adjust the condition of things to the position of trade, instead of adjusting trade to the condition of affairs, which is the bane of our capitalists. They are opening the new year with a humiliating exhibition of their lack of business sagacity, by crowding the Committee of Ways and Means with petitions to increase the "protection" of domestic manufactures; and the fact of so much reliance being placed upon the impotent expedients, is one of the worst auguries for a judicious avoidance of the difficulties which must beset business generally. Upon the whole we see little reason for hoping that the community have learnt much for late experience; and the em. barrassments being the same as last year, it may be presumed that the blunders and the misfortunes will be about the same also.

-The conservatory attached to the Executive mansion at Washington was damaged by fire to the extent of \$2,000 on Friday of last week. About onethird of the valuable plants, many of them of the rarest character and foreign origin, were destroyed.

The women of Greenfield, Ohio, who mobbed the liquor dealers some months ago, have been muleted into \$625 damages. Serves the unsexed creatures right.
