REMOVAL OF THE CAPITAL.—On Saturday last our contributor 'J.' in his 'Jottings,' unknown to us and entirely without our approbation, introduced Representative Myers' resolution for the removal of the State Capital to Philadelphia, with approving comments. Although not responsible for his utterances or opinions, we feel deeply mortified that our columns have been so used. 'J.' is a Philadelphian, and speaks from that standpoint, entirely disagree with him and Mr. Myers. There is also utterly no good reason, in our opinion, for such removal.
 The resolution of Mr. Myers was entirely uncalculated for, and we are surprised that he—a Democrat—should so readily fall in with the Radical mania for change—for leaving that which has been tried and is good, for that which is untried and of questionable utility. Democrats should be conservative in action as well as in principle.
 The State Capital is very well where it is. The public buildings have recently been enlarged and improved and the grounds have been enclosed with a costly iron fence and beautified to such an extent as to be a credit to the Commonwealth. The location is central and of easy, convenient and speedy access from the north, south, east and west by means of five railroads which radiate from Harrisburg in seven main lines, with which almost every branch railroad in the State connects. Ten hours travel suffice to get to the extreme western boundary, and from four to seven hours to the lines of New Jersey, New York and Maryland. Members therefore, can spend their Sundays at home, which many of them could not do if a change should be made. True, there do not exist here the same enormous corrupting influences of wealth that Philadelphia possesses, nor that immense population in which the moral delinquencies of pleasure seekers may be completely covered up; but, though lacking these—to some legislators potent considerations—our city possesses every other merit and advantage which honest, moral and upright law makers should desire.—Patriot and Uno.
