This question, whether and how lost men may be saved, is answered by Christianity alone. " For the Son of man is come to save that which was lost," Matthew 18, 11. 

AN IMPROVED WHITEWASH .- Dr. Jacobson has made a whitewash which is said to be almost as durable as paint, by dissolving 50 parts of glue in 159 parts of water, and adding 2 parts caustie soda; after boiling a flocculent procipitate separates, which may, however, be disregarded After the mixture has cooled he adds 50 parts of water glass, and stirs in enough oxyd of zine to make it of the proper consistency for painting. Two coats should be applied, and when dry a solution containing 10 per cent, of chloride of zine should be laid on, which gives it a beautiful gloss and greater durability. It is well suited for wood, metal, or brick, but should be applied as soon as made, for it cannot be kept long in the proper state.
