APPENDICITIS IS POPULAR

Nature of the Disease That Late Has Become Almost Fashionable... Not many years ago, a tolerably common report of the cause of death was inflammation of the bowels. It was a pretty general term and has since been divided into an almost infinite number of inflammations in the abdominal cavity...

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BOILING POINTS

There are innumerable and very a temperature scale... It is interesting to note that the temperature at which a liquid boils is the same as that at which the vapor is condensed, provided the pressure is the same...

What is generally understood by the boiling point of water is a temperature of 212 degrees on the Fahrenheit thermometric scale... The reason is that, at this temperature, the pressure of the vapor is equal to the pressure of the atmosphere...

A very curious result is arrived at if we carry a vessel of water in the receiver of an air pump and reduce the pressure to 500 of an atmosphere... At this pressure the boiling point of water is lowered to 32 degrees—that is, at this pressure water under ordinary pressure...

All liquids do not boil at the same temperature. Thus, while water under a pressure of one atmosphere boils at 212 degrees, alcohol, which passes more readily into the state of vapor, boils at 172.3 degrees and ether at 93.8 degrees...

Since increase of pressure retards the vaporization of a liquid, it follows that the boiling point of a gas by increasing the pressure of contraction... Consequently many gases are capable of being liquefied by pressure alone...
