

As sure as frost withers the green it
loves not only its succulence but much
of its nutritive value, and some other
kind of food must be given with it or
the flow of milk will decrease.

There should be regular hours for
feeding, not varying a minute, and the
animal will soon learn the proper times
and will come up to the barn from the
fields without being driven or called.

A single leak in a barn may cause
dampness and lead to disease of the
stock. The cost of preventing the dif-
ficulty will be almost nothing compared
with the saving of time and labor in
the treatment of disease.

The freezing point of potatoes is 30.2
degrees, and they must not be kept in
the light. Keep them at a tempera-
ture between 34 and 40 degrees (the
lower the temperature without freezing
the better), so as to prevent
sprouting.

When manure is hauled on the
ground and plowed under it is inti-
mately mixed with the soil, and espe-
cially if the land is plowed in the
fall when the manure is put on and
then plowed again in the spring. The
manure is in better condition for the
plants when it is down where the roots
can reach it, and it also undergoes
changes which fit it more completely
as plant food while in the soil during
the winter.

An excellent suggestion in a Western
journal is to have an old farm wagon
that is of but little value for any other
purpose other than for holding manure
near the stable and throw the manure
directly into the wagon, hauling it to
the field whenever a load is obtained.
By so doing there will be no barnyard
accumulations, and if the cornstalks
are shredded and the straw also cut,
the manure will reach the field in a
fine condition, the busy of hauling all
the manure on the farm when busy
being avoided.

ORD. ORDINANCE NO. 35

Ordinance No. 35 granting permission
to the Central District Printing
and Telegraph Company to erect
lines upon the streets and high-
ways of the Borough of Pat-
ton, Pa.

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the
Borough and Town Council of the Bor-
ough of Patton, in Council assembled,
and it is hereby enacted and ordained
that the permission of the same, that per-
mission be, and is hereby granted to the
Central District Printing and Tele-
graph Company, its successors and
assigns, to erect, operate and maintain
its lines upon, over and under such of
the public streets and alleys of the
Borough of Patton, as its business
may require, provided that the poles
shall be neat, symmetrical and painted,
and that no poles shall be less than
twenty-five feet in length.

SEC. 2. The poles shall be erected
under the supervision of the Burgess
and Street Committee, and shall be so
located as not to interfere with the use
of the streets by the public. Said
Company shall replace, and properly
relax any sidewalk or street pavement,
which may be displaced in the erection
of the poles, and upon failure to do after
twenty days notice, the Borough may
make such repairs at the expense of
said Company.

SEC. 3. In consideration of the
rights and privileges herein granted,
said Company shall furnish free of cost
to said Borough, space for its police
and fire alarm telegraph wires upon
the poles erected pursuant to this
Ordinance.

SEC. 4. Nothing in this Ordinance
contained shall be so construed as to
grant unto the said Company the ex-
clusive right, or to prevent the grant-
ing of similar privileges to other
individuals or companies for like
purposes.

SEC. 5. Said company shall indem-
nify the Borough of Patton against,
and assume the liability for damages
which may arise and accrue to said
Borough from any injuries to person
or property, from the doing of any
work herein authorized, or the neglect
of said Company of any of its em-
ployees to comply with any Ordinance
relative to the use of the streets and
alleys of said Borough; and the ac-
ceptance by the said Company of this
Ordinance shall be an agreement by it,
to pay to the said Borough any sum of
money for which the Borough may be-
come liable from, or by reason of such
injury.

SEC. 6. Said Company shall at all
times be subject to the Borough Ord-
inances now in existence, or which may
hereafter be passed relative to the use
of the public streets and alleys by
telephones and telegraph companies.

SEC. 7. Said Company shall file with
the Borough Council its acceptance of
this Ordinance within sixty days from
the date when it shall take effect.

SEC. 8. This Ordinance shall be in
full force from and after the date of its
passage and legal publication thereof,
providing the said Central District
Printing and Telegraph Company bear
all expenses incurred by publishing
and printing this Ordinance.
