For the past year the club has interested lineif especially in the outside lives of the working women.

An investigation of the moral conditions in which they are placed has been earried on. Factory girls have been most ready to report, and their reports have in general been much more favorable than those of girls employed in stores, but even here girls of innate purity of character and motive are safe, with a few exceptions. Only one or two employers were found in Boston who employed girls to extraordinary temptations, and against these men working girls were warned.

Some of the girls rather resented this nort of investigation and saked why the club workers did not do something practical, such as taking measures for the bettering of wages and the obtaining of aborter hours. In consequence the subject of early closing was agitated, and an organization was formed among the women, similar to the beneficial association of young men clerks, with a membership of over 100.


