

ORDINANCE NUMBER 38

An Ordinance preventing the erection of wooden buildings between Fourth and Sixth avenues on Magee avenue, and Lang and Beach avenues on Fifth avenue in Patton Borough.

SECTION 1. That hereafter and henceforth, there shall be no wooden dwelling houses, shops, ware-houses, carriage houses, stables or other tenements erected on Magee avenue between Fourth and Sixth avenues, nor on Fifth avenue between Lang and Beach avenues in Patton Borough.

SECTION 2. That whenever hereafter any person or persons are desirous of erecting, rebuilding, remodeling, changing or repairing any dwelling house, shop, warehouse, store, carriage house, stable, office or other tenement between Fourth and Sixth avenues on Magee avenue, or between Lang and Beach avenues on Fifth avenue in Patton Borough, he, she or they shall prepare a plan thereof showing the nature of the building to be erected, or the change to be made, and the material to be used, to which, he, she or they or their architect or contractor shall append his or their affidavit of the truth of the matters therein stated, and shall submit the same to the Council of the Borough, who shall, if they find the same in conformity to the Ordinance, issue a building permit for said building; after which said person or persons may proceed to erect or change said building or tenement in accordance with the plans and of the materials specified and in pursuance to said building permit.

SECTION 3. Any person or persons violating any of the provisions of the above Ordinance shall be subject to fine or penalty of from \$50 to \$100 (dollars), to be collected as debts of like kind are now by law collectible, and shall be restrained from erecting any building or tenement, or changing or altering any building or tenement, other than with non-combustible material.
