In view of the rapid growth of the District, consequent inadequate accommodations, overcrowded condition of schools and probable large increase of our school population in the immediate future.

Resolved, That the following proposition be submitted to the voters of Patton Borough at municipal election to be held on the third Tuesday of February, A. D., 1898 for the approval, viz: That the Patton School District be authorized to borrow not to exceed Six Thousand Dollars (\$6,000.00) at a rate of interest not to exceed 4 per cent.
