

PATTON COURIER SUPPLEMENT.

ORDINANCE NUMBER 41

An ordinance granting permission to George S. Good to erect poles and string electric light wires along the streets and alleys of the Borough of Patton for the purpose of lighting the same.

SECTION 1. Be it enacted and ordained by the Burgess and Town Council of the Borough of Patton, Pa., and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, that permission be and is hereby granted to George S. Good, his heirs, successors or assigns, to erect poles, string wires along the streets, lanes and alleys of the Borough of Patton, Pa., to operate and maintain a plant for the purpose of manufacturing and distributing electricity, lighting the streets, lanes and alleys, private residences, public buildings, work shops, stores, offices, etc., in the Borough of Patton, Pa., or surrounding vicinity, provided that the poles shall be neat and symmetrical in form, and no pole shall be less than twenty feet from the top to the ground, and no wire shall be less than twenty feet from the ground, and provided also that he shall always keep said wires properly insulated and harmless.

SEC. 2. The poles shall be erected under the supervision of the Burgess and Street Committee, and shall be located as not to interfere with the use of the streets by the public. Said George S. Good shall replace and properly relay any sidewalk or street pavement which may be displaced in the erection of the poles, and upon failure to do so, the Borough may make such repairs at the expense of the said George S. Good.

SEC. 3. In consideration of the granting of this franchise said George S. Good agrees to furnish light for the streets, residences, offices, shops, stores, etc., as low in price as the average price now or which may hereafter be charged in other towns in the State of Pennsylvania, and shall at all times furnish adequate light to meet all requirements of the citizens and the Borough of Patton, Pa. A failure at any time to furnish adequate light or lights as cheap as the average town in Pennsylvania, is now or hereafter may be furnished after thirty days notice from the Burgess and Town Council to do so, and failure to comply therewith, shall give the Borough the right to furnish light to the citizens and for the streets by a plant owned and operated by themselves, or shall give them the right to grant a franchise to any individual or corporation so to do.

SEC. 4. This ordinance shall be construed to give unto the said George S. Good the exclusive right to furnish light as above specified, but shall not be construed so as to prevent any one from furnishing light by electricity, gas or other manner for his, her or their own private use, or to prevent the Borough from furnishing its own light or to grant a like franchise to any person or corporation on the failure of said George S. Good to comply with the conditions hereof. And this franchise is granted and intended to be a perpetual franchise, defeasible only by breach of the terms and conditions herein contained.

SEC. 5. Said George S. Good shall indemnify the Borough of Patton against, and assume the liability for damages which may arise or accrue to said Borough from any injuries to person or property from the doing of any work herein authorized, or the neglect by said George S. Good or any of his employees to comply with any ordinance relative to the use of the streets and alleys of said Borough; and the acceptance by the said George S. Good of this ordinance shall be an agreement by him to pay the said Borough any sum of money for which the Borough may become liable, from or by reason of such injury.

SEC. 6. Said rights hereby granted shall at all times be subject to the Borough ordinances now in force or which may hereafter be passed relative to the use of the public streets and alleys by telephone or telegraph companies.

SEC. 7. Said George S. Good shall file with the Burgess and Town Council his acceptance of this ordinance within thirty days and shall begin work on said plant within fifteen months from the date hereof.

SEC. 8. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after the date of its passage, acceptance by George S. Good, and legal publication thereof, provided, however, said George S. Good shall bear all the expenses incurred by the publishing and printing this ordinance.

Enacted and ordained by the Town Council of Patton, Pa., the 21st day of January, 1898.
